"Connecting With Those Who Suffer"

A lot of people in our society have been impacted by the realities of increased suicide rates and the wholesale feeling of hopelessness. This workshop will explore some of those dynamics, and what the church needs to do to respond to human suffering. We will explore

the experience of trauma (the types of experiences that result in Post Traumatic Stress Disorder), as well as developmental trauma (the types of experiences that are the result of malnurturing life experiences). Both the shock trauma experiences and the developmental trauma experiences are culprits for many people who contemplate suicide. These are not the only



causes of suicide, but this workshop will focus on the realities of trauma and the correlation to the current drug epidemic and increased suicide/self-destructive behaviors. The bottom line is that people feel hopeless. Suicide is more often a desire to end the pain; it is not a desire to end life. We will look at the practice of spiritual disciplines as well as other self-regulation skills to combat the overwhelming feeling of despair when people are negatively triggered.

This event is open to ALL including: Lay Servants, Pastors, Local & Student Pastors, Health Care Workers, and Local Church Youth Workers.


During the program, participants will have the opportunity to tell about times they've felt fulfillment in their own lives.

IRS Standard Mileage Rates Go Down for 2017

Set annually by the IRS, taxpayers can use the standard mileage rates to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile.

Starting on January 1, 2017, the standard mileage rates for the use of a

car, van, pickup truck, or panel truck will be:

- 53.5 cents per mile for business miles driven (down from 54 cents for 2016).
- 17 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes (down from 19 cents for 2016).
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations (remains the same from 2016; based on federal statute).

The standard mileage rate for business is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile, including depreciation, insurance, repairs, tires, maintenance, gas, and oil.
