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Superintendent's View

I am thrilled to share with you that our students, in particular, and Humble ISD, in general, are in a better position this school year thanks to some of the positive developments that occurred in the 83rd Session of the Texas Legislature. I cannot give enough credit to our State Rep. Dan Huberty, the Humble ISD Board of Trustees, the Lake Houston Area Chamber of Commerce, Texans Advocating for Meaningful Student Assessment, Raise Your Hand Texas, and the countless teachers, parents and community members who voiced support on behalf of students.

The good news:

- ✓ Lawmakers listened to educators and parents' demands for a more meaningful and reasonable state testing program that allows us to teach children, not over test them. For high school students, state End-of-Course exams were reduced from 15 to five (Algebra I, Biology, U.S. History, English I and II).
- ✓ Some of the funding that was cut in the 82nd Legislative Session has been restored. Clearly, we are not where we were years ago or need to be to meet

student needs: Humble ISD lost \$24 million in the 2011 cut, and even before the cuts, our district already was defined by the State Comptroller's Financial Allocation Study for Texas as "very low spending." However, the restored funding allows us to better keep pace as our student population grows and remain focused on recruiting and retaining quality staff.

- ✓ Humble ISD's budget for 2013-2014 is balanced!
 - ✓ The new Foundation High School Graduation Plan approved by the Legislature will allow students more flexibility in the courses they choose and also allow them to earn endorsements in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math); Business and Industry; Public Services; Arts and Humanities; or Multidisciplinary Studies. High school counselors have been busy communicating with families about this new plan.
 - ✓ We are opening our 27th elementary school, Ridge Creek Elementary School, to serve the fast-growing southern portion of our district.
 - ✓ All of our elementary schools will have security vestibules. During the summer, construction began on retrofitting 18 older elementary campuses whose current designs did not provide that feature. Security vestibules feature controlled-access doors, physically requiring visitors to sign-in and be screened by a receptionist before they go past the greeter's desk. Construction also was completed on the new Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to support the work of the Humble ISD Police Department and the Department of Safe and Secure Schools.
- Our teachers, principals and support staff are eager to welcome approximately 37,600 students to the 2013-2014 school year. We look forward to preparing your children for bright futures and unlimited success!

Welcome from the Board of Trustees

Going into the 2013-2014 school year, I have never been more proud to be associated with Humble ISD. We have been hailed as being among the finest school districts in the state of Texas thanks to the district's dedicated and professional staff and our extraordinarily supportive parent and business community.

In a state with more than 1,000 school districts, it's hard to be humble about our district's amazing teachers, staff, parents and community partners. Your commitment to quality education is why Humble ISD has become one of the finest places in America for kids to learn and grow.

Here are some recent accolades:

★ Humble ISD was among five State Finalists in the Large District Category in the H-E-B Excellence in Education Awards for which we received a \$5,000 grant as part of the recognition. In the application, our district's commitment to student success was noted even during significant, rapid enrollment and drastic state budget cuts.

★ Thirty campuses were awarded "No Place for Hate" banners by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) after submitting documentation about school-wide activities that students and staff organized and implemented to stand up against bullying and promote respect. "To have so many schools in one district receiving the No Place for Hate designation shows a commitment by Humble ISD to their students," Susan Shaw, Associate Director of the ADL's Southwest Region, said. "We are overwhelmed by their efforts to provide students and staff with a safe and welcoming climate at school." These types of activities occur at all Humble ISD schools and even more campuses in the district plan to apply for this special recognition during the upcoming school year.

★ This summer, Dr. Guy Sconzo, our Superintendent, was chosen as the Region 4 Superintendent of the Year. Region 4 encompasses 50 school districts in the Houston area. He was selected because he provides extraordinary leadership and has since 2001. He also is among four superintendents from Texas chosen to serve on the American Association of School Administrators' Governing Board.

As the father of two daughters attending middle school in Humble ISD and the husband of a high school teacher, I couldn't personally be more grateful to the outstanding teachers and school staff members who work tirelessly for my daughters and all the children in Humble ISD. As I witness every night in my own home, teachers don't just work an eight-hour day. They offer before-and-after-school tutoring sessions to help students master challenging academic concepts, lead musical and theatrical rehearsals, organize club meetings and coach athletics. Teachers plan lessons and grade papers, entering information into Home Access Center and posting information to school websites so parents remain informed of their children's academic progress. They inspire students to go further in their learning with interesting assignments, encouraging words, and orderly and inviting classroom environments. Support staff members ensure students experience safe school bus rides, nourishment in school cafeterias, clean campuses and secure schools. Everyone continually seeks out improved ways of meeting changing student needs.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, our thanks to the Humble ISD staff for being there, day in and day out, for our kids and all the kids in Humble ISD! We have tremendous gratitude to this community for valuing education and supporting our schools and our students. Because of you, we can all be "Proud to be Humble ISD!"

Humble ISD's Dr. Guy Sconzo named Region 4 Superintendent of the Year



Dr. Guy Sconzo is the 2013 Superintendent of the Year for Region 4 Education Service Center (ESC). Region 4 ESC encompasses more than 1 million students in 50 school districts. Dr. Sconzo is among 16 other regional winners in Texas. There are more than 1,000 school districts in the state.

Dr. Pam Wells, Executive Director of Region 4 ESC, said "Dr. Sconzo is an exceptional leader and a deserving recipient of this honor. He will be a tremendous representative of the superintendents and educators in our region. We wish him well as he joins the prestigious group of leaders who are nominated for State Superintendent of the Year."

Brent M. Engelage, Humble ISD Board of Trustees President, also expressed his esteem for Dr. Sconzo and his accomplishment. "We are so excited and pleased for Dr. Sconzo," said Engelage. "To say that Dr. Sconzo is 'deserving' of this honor is probably the understatement of the year. Dr. Sconzo's name throughout the State is well known and always associated with excellence."

During his 13-year tenure as Superintendent for Humble ISD, Dr. Sconzo successfully managed the District through a time of rapid growth as enrollment increased by more than 10,000 students. He advocated for students, proactively seeking academic programs that address the changing needs of Humble ISD. Dr. Sconzo instituted campus visits, going to each of the District's 40 schools at least twice per year and building relationships with principals and teachers.

Under Dr. Sconzo's leadership, Humble ISD was named one of five Large District State Finalists in the 2013 H-E-B Excellence in Education Awards. His leadership in the community has included the Flaming Arrow District of Boy Scouts of America, Memorial Hermann Northeast Hospital Board, Lake Houston Family YMCA Board and the Lake Houston Area Chamber of Commerce Board. Dr. Sconzo was the first superintendent in Texas asked to testify in the current school finance lawsuit seeking a more fair and adequate funding system to better serve the needs of all Texas students.

Charles Cunningham, Immediate Past President of the Humble ISD Board of Trustees, echoes the sentiments of many in the community. "I want to congratulate my good friend on this great accomplishment," said Cunningham. "Region 4 ESC has validated what our teachers, staff, administrators and Board



have always known – this Guy is Humble-iev-able!"

Dr. Sconzo is honored to represent both Humble ISD and Region 4 ESC at the state level, and credits others for this achievement.

"This is truly recognition for us all," said Dr. Sconzo. "We have a phenomenal team of teachers, administrators and Board members who deserve this recognition for the work they do every day for our students."

The Superintendent of the Year Award Program is sponsored by the Texas Association of School Boards. Eligible applicants must first be nominated by their local school board and are evaluated based upon information submitted. A state selection committee interviews regional winners in Austin on August 23-24 and names five state finalists. The Superintendent of the Year will be announced September 28 at the Texas Association of School Administrators/Texas Association of School Boards Convention in Dallas.

Trustee Charles Cunningham serves in Houston area leadership position



School Board Trustee Charles Cunningham was elected First Vice President of the Gulf Coast Area Association of School Boards (GCAASB) for 2013-2014.

The GCAASB is a voluntary organization composed of more than 50 school boards in the greater Houston area to enhance the quality of education for public school children in the Texas Gulf Coast area by providing education and information to local school boards, and creating an opportunity for local school boards to impact legislation affecting the public schools.

"The experience that Mr. Cunningham has gained on the local Board of Trustees will benefit all of the students, staffs, and schools in the Gulf Coast Area Association as it is combined on the Executive Board with the experience of trustees from 14 other school districts," said GCAASB Executive Secretary Jerry Smith. "That leadership will be meaningful!"

Other trustees serving as GCAASB Directors serve in Channelview ISD, Clear Creek ISD, Columbia-Brazoria ISD, Cypress-Fairbanks ISD, Friendswood ISD, Katy ISD, La Porte ISD, Needville ISD, Stafford MSD and Tomball ISD.



Passion for teaching inspires, drives District Teachers of the Year

Humble ISD is proud to honor the 2013-14 Teachers of the Year. **Joanna Grigsby** of Elm Grove Elementary is Elementary Teacher of the Year. **Samuel Pollard** of Summer Creek High School is Secondary Teacher of the Year. They were chosen from 43 Campus Teachers of the Year.



Joanna Grigsby has spent the last 13 years inspiring students to reach for their potential. She adheres to the philosophy that educators must, above all else, shape responsible and confident students capable of taking on challenges and hard work.

“Every child that comes in my classroom is an individual,” said Grigsby. “They’re born with all the potential they’ll ever need; it’s inside of them. They have to realize that potential and pull it out. That’s my job as a teacher, to reach inside of them and pull out the best of who they are.”

Grigsby teaches 5th grade at Elm Grove Elementary. She began teaching in 2000 after a period of troublesome times through middle school, high school and college. After serving as a key witness for her mother’s defense on a murder trial, she quickly became distracted and withdrawn in school. She credits her teacher for getting her through some of the toughest times.

“There was one teacher,” Grigsby recalls, “who would seek me out every day – and she would say the same two sentences: ‘You can do this. It’s going to be ok.’ I didn’t know what ‘it’ was, or what I was going to do, but she was convinced I would do it. Her words encouraged me to live beyond my circumstances.”

Although her mother was acquit-

ted, Grigsby’s life did not get easier. The words “white trash” were flung her way, and eventually she dropped out. She managed to earn her GED and press through a twelve-year, on-again, off-again college career to graduate at the top of her class.

“During the interview with my first principal, I shared my story and that I was living with my two children in a trailer with holes in the roof. She held my hand and said, ‘Honey, teachers aren’t perfect people from perfect backgrounds. They are people who are committed to making a difference.’”

Grigsby held to that commitment. She created the Helping Hands program to groom 5th graders as mentors for younger students. She started the Elm Grove Elementary News as a campus character-building tool that includes anti-bullying and social awareness initiatives. She also built the School Store program in which 5th graders run a business that generates income for the school, teaches responsibility and encourages a strong business sense.

Most impressive is Grigsby’s passion in her role as a teacher. She remains focused on the individual child, drawing upon her past to help shape the future for her students.

“I made the right choice. If I can make the difference in one child’s life, the long road to get here would be worth it.”

Samuel Pollard knew early in high school that he wanted to be a teacher. Pollard, who teaches AP world history at Summer Creek High School, was strongly influenced by his history teacher, Mr. Wesbrook, who pushed Pollard to a higher standard. He remembers skimming by in his classes until being challenged by Mr. Wesbrook, who saw the complacency and awarded his efforts with a ‘D.’

“I barely scraped by in his class, earning a D, which accurately represented my efforts, and graduated in spite of myself,” said Pollard.

Through college, Pollard struggled with balancing social life and school work. Old habits plagued him, he dropped out of school and lost a sense of direction in his life. He drifted through a few more years before he remembered his dream of becoming a teacher – and the hard lesson he had learned from Mr. Wesbrook.

“I finally appreciated that I learned more in his class—getting a D – than I did in any other class. He was never satisfied with anything less than my best, and I couldn’t be either. I went back to school and finished my degree.”

Today, Pollard applies the same principles and standards he learned from Mr. Wesbrook.

“I use the tough times I went through as a way to drive kids in the right direction. I never apologize to my

students for pushing them. My role as a teacher extends beyond the prescribed curriculum and into the lives of my students. If I can help kids steer themselves in the right direction, then I’ve done my job.”

Pollard began teaching in Humble ISD in 2006. He serves in a national leadership role as a Certified College Board AP World History scorer, developing and writing curriculum for training other AP teachers on college standards. Pollard serves as the Chief Organizer for the Advanced Academic Academy on his campus, as well as the AP Teacher Leader in developing and administering training in the backwards design model, which focuses on student outcomes and applying a curriculum to achieve them. He taught at Humble and Kingwood high schools before accepting the position at Summer Creek.

“I found my home at Summer Creek, and I wouldn’t leave here for anything,” said Pollard.

Pollard reminds other teachers to hold on to what made them become a teacher, and to never forget their students.

“In all the madness, lesson planning, training and professional development, don’t forget your kids. Sometimes the kids get lost in all that, but it’s not their fault, and they still have to learn. A good teacher can still teach regardless of all that.”

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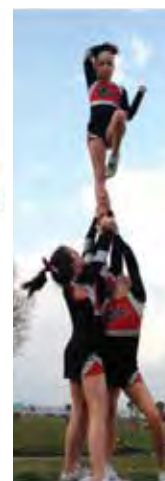

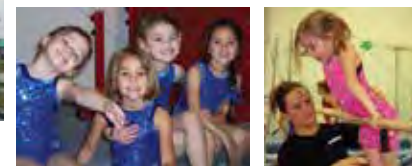

Humble ISD is responsible for identifying, locating and evaluating all children with disabilities who are in need of special education and related services who reside and/or are located within the school district's boundaries or attend a private school within the district's boundaries, even if they are not district residents.

Children who have a disability or who are suspected of having a disability may be referred to Humble ISD through one of the following means:

- For children of district residents, who are school-age (3 to 21), please contact the elementary, middle, or high school that serves your particular neighborhood or location.
- For children of district residents who are below school-age (birth through 2 years old), please contact the Special Education Department at 281-641-8406 or one of the following Early Childhood Intervention (ECI) Agencies:

ECI Bay Area Program at 281-838-4477 (areas with zip code area 77044)
- For children who are out of district but attending a private school within the district, please contact the Special Education Office at 281-641-8404.

If you are unsure about which school would serve your neighborhood or location, or if you are making the referral during the summer, please call the Special Education Department at 281-641-8406. All referrals are confidential and the parent, legal guardian, or surrogate parent has the right to refuse services.

Back-to-school information for all students

All students new to Humble ISD must register online at www.humbleisd.net/Page/34,

then contact their child's school to complete the enrollment process. Enrollment information for each campus is listed on pages 13-16.

Parents of all returning students must update each child's enrollment information via Home Access Center (HAC) between Aug. 5 and Sept. 6. Visit <https://eshac.humble.k12.tx.us/homeaccess/> to update or to set up your account. Orientation and packet return information for each campus is included on pages 13-16. All new and returning students must show proof of residency to register for 2013-14. School websites will have the most up-to-date schedules and any additional information.

Along with signed forms, parents will need to bring to New Student Registration:

- ✓ Child's official birth certificate (not hospital certificate)
- ✓ Immunization records
- ✓ Child's social security card
- ✓ Proof of residency in Humble ISD

- ✓ Previous school's mailing address
- ✓ Last report card and/or school transcript
- ✓ Parent's driver's license for identification purposes

Additional information for Pre-K Registration:

Parents must bring documents that show qualification for the program.

- ✓ If based on income: proof of household income (pay receipts for previous 30 days or food stamp letter).
- ✓ If based on language: the child should be present at registration for testing.
- ✓ If based on military service: Department of Defense identification; or copy of death certificate from Department of Defense or memorandum signed by the Casualty Office; or copy of Purple Heart orders or citation or copy of the Line of Duty Determination or copy of an official letter from commander.

If you moved to a different school in Humble ISD:

- ✓ Inform your child's former school and request that they send records to the new school.

- ✓ Show proof of residency at the new school during new student registration.

What are acceptable forms of Proof of Residency?

- ✓ If you live in a house: gas, water or electric bill in the name of the parent. Bill must be dated no earlier than July 1, 2013.
- ✓ If you live in an apartment: Copy of lease showing parent as person leasing apartment and showing student as occupant.
- ✓ If you are in a new home and have not yet received a utility bill: Copy of the lease or sales contract. Earnest money contracts are not accepted.
- ✓ If you reside with another family: Address affidavit (available at the schools) and a current utility bill in the name of the person with whom you reside. The form requires the signatures of all homeowners and the parent and must be notarized.
- ✓ If someone other than a parent needs to enroll a student: Guardianship packets are available at the schools. Paperwork must be completed prior to enrolling.



Pre-Kindergarten Registration

Humble ISD offers a free half-day pre-kindergarten program for eligible four year olds. Eligible children include those who have difficulty speaking and comprehending English, meet free or reduced lunch guidelines, are in foster care or are homeless. Others who qualify include the child or stepchild of active duty members of the U.S. military (including the state military forces or a reserve component ordered to active duty) and the child or stepchild of those killed or injured while serving active duty. Children who are or have been in the conservatorship of the state Department of Family and Protective Services following an adversary hearing under Family Code Section 262.201 are also eligible.

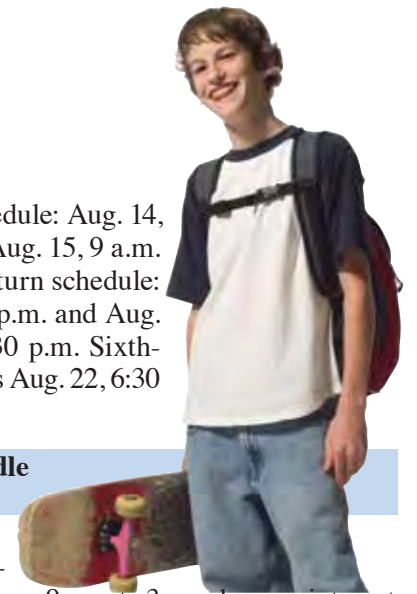

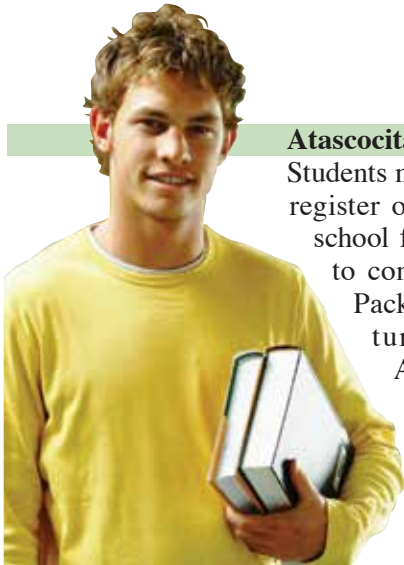

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Best Buddies create a dream vacation

From Magic Kingdom to Epcot Center, students in the Best Buddies program at Kingwood Park High School spent a week at “the happiest place on earth.”

“The trip started as a dream of something we would like to do,” said Robin Pullen, KPHS Teacher and Best Buddies sponsor. “Many of my students will never go on a vacation with friends or stay at a hotel without their parents. This gave them the chance to do something that they might never get to do.”

Teamwork and determination turned that dream into a reality as Best Buddies raised funds for the trip.

Best Buddies is a national non-profit organization that pairs general education students with special education students to build friendships and promote acceptance. Pullen brought the program to KPHS.



“My mission is to give kids with disabilities the opportunity to be a ‘typical’ teen,” said Pullen. “To see movies with friends, go to parties, talk on the phone, walk into the lunchroom and have people to say ‘what’s up’... simple things we take for granted mean the world to these kids. I want to teach acceptance and compassion at school, for the student body to see special needs students for who they really are: friends, teenagers, people, and individuals.”

The program’s success has been inspirational. Best Buddies International named Kingwood Park Best Buddies the Most Outstanding Chapter in Texas in 2010-11. The program also exists at Atascocita, Kingwood and Summer Creek high schools.

“Best Buddies brings hope to families of students with disabilities and teen friendships for many who face a lifetime of isolation,” said Ellen Shimer, Special Education Coordinator and parent of a special needs student. “In the process, typical teens are creating a kinder, gentler and more accepting world one friendship at a time.”

The group’s teamwork to plan the trip and make life-long memories is proof that Best Buddies changes lives. “The support we received as we fundraised and planned blows my mind,” said Pullen, “I feel blessed to work with such incredible young adults and their families!”



Ridge Creek Elementary opens for 2013-2014

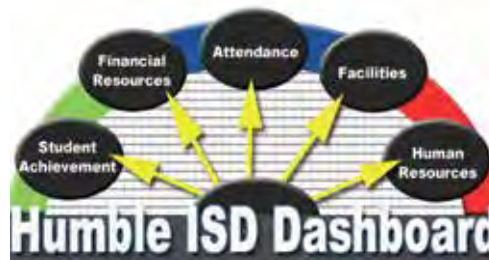

Varicella 1 dose - on or after the first birthday ^{4, 5}

Varicella 2 doses - first dose after first birthday ^{3, 4}
Meningococcal - 1 dose

- 2 2 doses meet requirement if adult hepatitis B vaccine (Recombivax) was given. Dosage and type of vaccine must be clearly documented.

GRADE 12

Same as grades 8 -11 above without meningococcal and only one dose of Varicella.

Students in Classes on College Campus

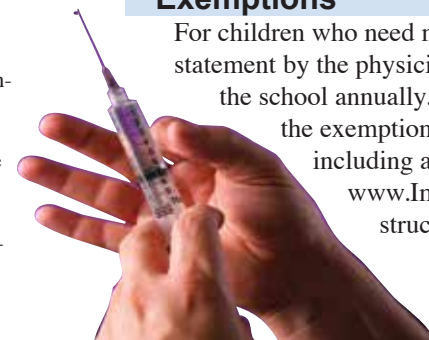
All students attending classes at Quest Early College High School or any other college campus (including Community Colleges) must have a Meningococcal immunization within the past 5 years. The immunization must be administered more than 10 days prior to attendance.

Vaccinations Received Outside the U.S.

Records of vaccinations received outside the U.S. must be adequately documented and comparable to the schedule and dosage recommended by the State of Texas. Foreign immunization records must be legible and officially certified. The District reserves the right to question all documents and request verification of any or all records by a private physician.

Exemptions

For children who need medical exemptions, a written statement by the physician should be submitted to the school annually. Parents/guardians choosing the exemption for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief, should visit www.ImmunizeTexas.com for instructions.



Immunizations clinics

Families who have used city and county health centers in prior years for back-to-school immunizations may find that this is not an option for them this year, as eligibility requirements have changed. Most students need updated immunizations when entering the seventh grade.

City and county health centers will provide immunizations to students on Medicaid or with no insurance. Students with insurance must find another option, such as a doctor's office or pharmacy. Any health care provider will know which immunizations are required of Texas public school students.

For your convenience, Humble ISD has partnered with Texas Vaccine Institute (TVI) to offer immunization clinics that are open to all students. Immunizations will cost \$10 each, by cash or check. Blue Cross Blue Shield, TRS Blue Cross Blue Shield, and Medicaid cards are accepted.

New Emergency Operations Center opens



Student safety is always a top priority, and Humble ISD's Emergency Operations Center was designed with security in mind. The new building, which houses Humble ISD Safe & Secure Schools as well as the Humble ISD Police Department, allows police officers and emergency management officials to work most effectively and make use of technology to meet the safety and security needs of schools.

"My wife and I have two daughters who attend Humble ISD schools. I believe that safe and secure schools are extremely important and add great value to our community and peace of mind to all parents in our district," Humble ISD Board President Brent Engelage said.

Construction funding was provided by bonds approved by voters in 2008. Humble ISD was also awarded \$394,000 in the federally funded Readiness and Emergency Management in Schools (REMS) Grant. Part of this grant was used to obtain a state-of-the-art emergency communications console that allows the Humble ISD Police Dispatch to simulta-

neously communicate with all responding agencies in the event of an emergency.

Key features of the new Emergency Operations Center, located at 1703 Wilson Road in Humble, include: a secure dispatch center; a secure evidence storage room; separate adult and juvenile processing areas; a secure, enclosed drive-through area for the transport of offenders in compliance with state guidelines; a conference room with data and communication infrastructure for emergency management; and administrative, staff and training office space.

Children are provided a healthy snack, an opportunity to complete homework, a variety of self-directed activities, special projects, arts and crafts, and indoor/outdoor recreational play supervised by trained and caring YMCA staff. In addition, counselors provide a daily curriculum, which includes math and science, health and wellness, and character development. The program is licensed by the Texas Department of Family Protective Services (TDFPS),

and all YMCA staff members receive 40 hours of annual training in CPR, AED, first aid and child abuse prevention, lead staff are at least 21 years old.

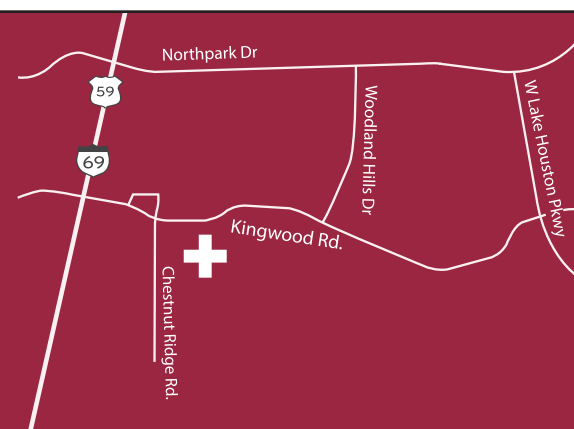
