







Your BT Home Hub

Your BT Home Hub is a broadband router that can connect computers to the internet using wired or wireless connections. Your Hub can share the internet across separate computers and devices (e.g. games consoles) and BT services such as BT Vision.

And with the latest BT Home Hub, you get Smart Wireless™, which automatically picks the strongest wireless channel to give you the most reliable connection.

Ways to connect to broadband

Using wireless broadband

Wireless broadband (wi-fi) is an easy way to connect your computers, games consoles and other devices (including some mobile phones and printers) to your Hub. It's handy because it means you can access BT Total Broadband around your home – without having cables everywhere.

When you connect using wireless, make sure you connect to your Hub's network name (it will start with 'BTHub3...') rather than one of the many BT FON or BT Openzone hotspots that are around.

Connecting with a cable (wired broadband)

A wireless connection is great but it can sometimes get interference, which can affect your internet browsing. An Ethernet cable isn't affected by such interference, so if your computer's near your Hub you might want to connect using Ethernet.

Broadband speeds

Broadband speeds vary and can go up and down throughout the day.

The maximum speed your line can support depends on a number of factors, the main one being how far you live from your exchange. If you want to check your speed, you'll get a more accurate result after about 24 hours when your line's settled down.

What can affect my broadband speed?

With BT Total Broadband and your BT Home Hub. you might decide to add a number of services to your home network. Bear in mind that these, along with your other online activities – such as surfing. watching online video, gaming online or downloading files – could leave you with a busy broadband line.

Give it 24 hours to settle

If it's less than 24 hours since you first connected your Hub to broadband, please wait a little longer before checking your speed.

To make sure you get the fastest, most reliable service possible on your line, we'll remotely test it for up to 24 hours after you first connect your Hub. This may occasionally interrupt your service and cause your speed to vary. This is normal, and your speed will settle down after 24 hours

Problems connecting?

If you can't get online, try:

1 Restarting

Before trying anything else, restart your computer and your Hub. This fixes most connection problems.

To restart your Hub, press and release the **Restart** button on its back. Wait for the Power and Broadband lights to turn blue.

2 Running desktop help (PCs only) – new and better than ever

If restarting didn't work, run free BT Broadband Desktop Help – just double-click ion your desktop. If it isn't on your desktop, you can download BT Broadband Desktop Help at www.bt.com/help/broadbanddesktophelp

- support you 24 hours a day
- help you get back online
- set up or troubleshoot your email account
