

Have you noticed our new bulletin cover? What is the connection between the Cross & Christ the King?

The seat of power for any king or queen is the throne. Once they are crowned and enthroned, it becomes the location from which monarchs reigned and decided the fate of their subjects. Anything decreed from the throne carried royal authority. In the Catholic tradition we have long associated the wood of the Cross as the earthly throne of Jesus, our King. It is from the Cross that He sealed our fate and decreed our salvation. In the words of Pope Francis: "Jesus enters Jerusalem in order to die on the Cross. And it is precisely here that his kingship shines forth in godly fashion: his royal throne is the wood of the Cross!" (Palm Sunday 2013). The Teacher's message is clear: while the great people of the Earth build themselves 'thrones' for their own power, God chooses an uncomfortable throne, the cross, from which to reign by giving his life. Living in Gratitude, by Deacon Dan

In our Gospel this week, we hear about the grateful leper. I was reading a reflection by a Fr. John Bartunek LC, who said, "To this day, leprosy is an incurable disease... Yet Christ cures these ten lepers with a mere command. Showing oneself to the priest was a requirement of Old Testament law for anyone who claimed to have been cured from leprosy to insure a full cure. They took this precaution because leprosy is highly contagious, and a miscalculation in an individual case could cause a severe outbreak among a whole village or city. Christ's power rarely appears so clearly as when he commands the powers of nature for the benefit of the people he came to save—Jews and gentiles alike."

Have you ever been in a situation where it seems that Jesus is the only hope you have left? I know I have had that feeling where Jesus was my only hope to get through a situation. When I was in the hospital and told that I was going to lose my foot, there were some very dark times, but I never lost sight or the feeling that Jesus was close to me, and would never, ever leave me. The day before my surgery was Father's Day. The hospital let me out for the day, which was wonderful, but I had the knowledge of what was coming the next day, made it very challenging. In a very real sense it was the best day, and the worst day. Still through all that, I knew Jesus was with me and I was most grateful. It was the same for the lepers; they were left with the knowledge that Jesus was their only hope. So for the leper who came back, he shows the gratitude and thankfulness to God, which I believe is the main teaching from this Gospel reading. We are to live in gratitude to the Lord, no matter our circumstances, because with Him we can get though anything. God bless you all!




Assembly of the People of God
