## Classroom bethavior and Management

Individual
Each student will receive a daily self-assessment sheet at the beginning of the week, called their Jacobson Jet Chart. Their behavior will be recorded on this sheet and go home each night and must be brought back the next day with parents initials! Help make the connection between school and home and talke about your child's bethavior that particullar day with them.

## Class

When the whole class makes Jacobson Jet choices together and shows good character they are rewarded by a handful of marbles in the "Caught Showing Character Jar.". When the jar is full the class will earn a celebration of some sont that they vote on together. This jar helps promote teamwork and cooperation in the classroom.

## Reศबing

Our district has adopted the Harcourt Reading Program, which incorporates the Big 5:

- \#Phonemic Awareness- the understanding that spoken words are made of individual sounds
1a Phonics- the process of decoding and translating the written word into speech
Q\#Fluency- the ability to read with speed, accuracy and expression at an appropriate rate
\& Vocabulary- the more words a student acquires, the better chance they will have for success in reading, writing, and spelling
© Comprehension - the complex process of constructing meaning from text


## Reading

The reading block is 90 minutes long and is made up of 30 minutes of on grade level whole group instruction, followed by 60 minutes of guided reading groups and reading rotations. The reading groups are made to meet the individual needs of readers at their instructional reading level.

## Reading

Once the school year gets underway, the children will be bringing home a book bag nightly. In this bag will be ability appropriate material for your child to focus on. I often send home a book/story 2 nights in a row.

Reading Goals: Master sound/symbol relationships

- Blend sounds to read a words
- Read with understanding
- Be an active participant in the learning process
- Develop listening skills through exposure to high quality literature selections
- Develop literall,logical, and critical thinking skills
- Develop oral reading fluency


## Writing

My students will follow a writing workshop model during writing time. Their writing block is an hour long each day and incorporates the following: teacher led mini-lessons, writing time, and sharing. During writing workshop throughout the year the following will be taught and addressed:

EGenre studies (stories, personal narratives, friendly letters, poetry, and reports)
$\neq$ Writing process (prewriting, drafting, revising, editing and publishing)
16 Traits (voice, conventions, sentence fluency, organization, ideas, and word choice)

## Writing

Qour child will be writing daily. You will note that many times his/her papers will have spelling and mechanical errors, which will not be corrected. I encourage students to enjoy writing by encouraging them and focusing on what they did do rather than what they did not. When I model through my writing and read alouds the students begin to incorporate and become aware of skills they need to include in their writing. The more opportunities that children have to write the more they begin to practice key writing skills.

## MATH

Many different methods will be used to teach math concepts in my classroom. We will use a combination of hands on activities with manipulatives, exploration, drill and skill practice and games. These will be used to introduce, reinforce, and review concepts being taught.

## Homework

Chandler School District Policy requires that first grade children have homework for about 10-25 minutes daily. Your child will be bringing home a blue folder every day. Please check the folder for items to return. Please make sure that your child brings this blue folder back to school everyday and you check it daily. If for some reason the folder gets misplaced let me know so I can provide the child with a new one. Homework is a golden opportunity to teach responsibility and good study habits. Homework will be given in a variety of ways in order to meet the needs of all students.

## Homework

Daily reading logs: Next week your student will receive a reading book bag. In the bag will be the current book they are reading in reading groups along with a reading log. It is important that your child reads to you every night to practice fluency and comprehension and that you sign the reading log.

## Homework

Weekly spelling homework: We will have weekly spelling words and take a spelling test each Friday. The spelling words will. correlate with the sound of the week and vocabulary words. Spelling homework is mandatory and will be sent home Monday in the homework folders. Keep the list and practice sheet and turn it in on Friday so you can practice and study the words all week for the spelling test that takes place on Friday.

## Evaluating Students

I use a variety of ways to evaluate each student. I find out what they know and understand by: daily observations, listening to oral responses and discussions, writing and reading conferences, formal assessments, observing them working and saving samples to show progress.

## Star Student

Each week a student will be in the spotlight as our "Super Star". If your child is super star for the week, I will send home on the the Friday before their week a packet of directions.

Q. Monday- Please bring in your completed Student of the Week Poster. You will share it with your class today and we will hang it on our wall! Be creative!
(2. Tuesday- Please put an item in the mystery box write 5 clues about the item. You will give the clues to your friends and they will try to guess what it is. Try to make the clues tricky so we don't guess the item right away!
a Wednesday - Estimation Jar - Choose your child's favorite treat to place in the Estimation Jar (keep the number of items a secret!) The students will all make guesses as to how many items are in the jar. Then we will see who was the closest and enjoy the treat!
(2 Thursday- How To- On this day you will teach the class how to do something you enjoy. Type the directions in sequential order in less than 10 steps. You will present the steps and teach the class the activity. You are welcome to bring any props you need. For example: How to Tie Your Shoe or How to Swing a Baseball Bat.
(a3 Friday - The class will brainstorm a web of facts about our Super Star such as; our star's favorites, our star's family, words that describe our star. things our star likes to do, and any other facts the children know about the star! Classmates will use the web to write a letter to our Super Star. The letters will go home in a book the following week!
