UHD Department of Urban Education is a state-approved Center for Professional Development of Teachers (CPDT)

Our goal is to prepare future teachers to enhance academic success for at-risk children and adolescents in urban schools.

To meet this goal we are currently partnered with multiple regional school districts in PD 1 and 2 including Alief, Aldine, Cy-Fair, Houston, Humble, and Klein.

Professional Development Curriculum Texas Teacher Preparation Standards

The Texas Teacher Preparation Standards are based on the staterequired curriculum for students (the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills or TEKS) and form the basis for the Texas Examinations of Educator Standards (TEXES).

Standards are measured by:

- 1. Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities (PPR) Exam
 - All PPR exams cover EC-12 grade levels.
- 2. Content Exams (EC-6 Generalist, EC-6 Bilingual Generalist, Grade 4-8 Generalist, and 8-12 Secondary content-areas)

Features of PD1 and PD2

PD1: Understanding the Learner

- EC-6 Generalist, EC-6 Bilingual, and 4-8 Generalist Programs:
 Consist of courses in understanding the learner and content methodology
- 8-12 Program: Consists of courses in understanding the learner, classroom environment, and professional roles

PD2: Enhancing Student Achievement

- EC-6 Generalist, EC-6 Bilingual, and 4-8 Generalist Programs:
 Consist of courses in content methodology
- 8-12 Program: Consists of courses in literacy, instructional design, and assessment

PD1 and 2 semesters each include a minimum of 60 field-work clock hours. This requirement is to be met using a 6 hour per week schedule over a ten week period.

Academic Criteria for PD1 and PD2

- Maintain 2.5 GPA
- Complete 9 semester credit hours of integrated course work (<u>Grade "C" or higher is required for each block course</u>)
 - Students may not proceed to the next PD semester until a grade of C or higher is obtained in all courses in the PD semester. Three documents describe criteria for successful completion and advancement to the next Professional Development semester (courses).

- Communicate clearly, effectively, and professionally at all times (verbally, in writing, and through other forms of communication).

Professional Criteria for PD1 and PD2

Adhere to and receive satisfactory ratings or higher on:

- All seven UHD-CPDT Teacher Candidate Criteria for Field Work Component (page 27 of handbook)
- Code of Ethics and Standard Practices for Teacher Educators (pages 80-81 of handbook)
- UHD-CPDT Professional Attributes for Teacher Candidates (page 28 of handbook)

State/District Requirements

Currently all participating districts require completion of a criminal history background check. Districts may deny field-placement based on the results.

Background checks may require a paper form to be completed or the submission of an online background check. Additionally, some districts require a copy of your current Texas driver's license.

Program Completion and Certification Recommendation Requirements

- Maintain a 2.5 GPA based on UHD-CPDT calculation policy
- Successfully complete all course requirements
- Successfully complete all Criteria to Pass the Fieldwork Component
- Adhere to all components of the UHD-CPDT Academic and Professional policy
- Pass TEXES PPR and Content exams in declared area of certification
- EC-6 Bilingual teacher candidates must also pass the Bilingual Target Language Proficiency (BTLPT)
- No University of Houston-Downtown "holds" or fees owed
- No current academic probation or suspension status

Additional Program Completion and Certification Recommendation Requirements

- Apply for recommendation for certification through the TEAL website
- Submit Recommendation Request on the Department of Urban Education website under "Certification"
- Earn degree

UHD-CPDT Diagnostic Experience

The Diagnostic Experience is an essential part of our program and is required during the PD semesters. It is designed to:

- o help you understand your strengths and weaknesses
- practice essential test taking skills
- o inform professors so they can customize instruction

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UHD-CPDT Diagnostic Experience Information for Day of the Experience

What to bring on test day:

- Printed admission ticket (sent through gatormail)-You cannot bring your phone into the test to show your admission ticket via e-mail. Keep this ticket for the postdiagnostic exam as well.
- A non-expired, non-damaged government-issued photo ID with signature (UHD ID is not permitted.)
- Plenty of Sharpened Pencils

What NOT to bring on test day:

- Personal belongings (including your student ID), wireless communication devices, copying devices or listening devices, hats, digital watches, alarm watches or wristwatch cameras
- Notes (scratch paper will be provided), dictionaries, books or any other unauthorized testing aids, mechanical pencils, pens, highlighters, rulers, or calculators (Calculators are provided for approved booklets only.)
- Food, beverages, or tobacco products

Testing Services does not provide storage areas for items listed above. Please adhere to the above policies. There can be no exceptions.

Diagnostic Experience Important Dates

- August 25-All PD1 and PD2 students will be billed \$40 for the diagnostic experience. This portion of the bill will need to be paid prior to testing.
- August 29-Admission tickets will be sent to your gatormail accounts. Print this ticket and save the email.
- September 5-Send requests to change testing date to Dr. Farmer in testing services at <u>farmers@uhd.edu</u>.

Pre-Diagnostic Experience for PD1 PPR Exam and PD2 Content Exam

- September 12 or 13
 - PD1 ACP students will take content exam to prepare for required TExES exam.

Post-Diagnostic Experience for PD1 PPR and PD2 Content Exam

- November 7 or 8
 - PD1 ACP students will take content exam for post-diagnostic.

UHD-CPDT Diagnostic Experience 80% passing policy

Each student's Diagnostic scores will be reviewed during PD1 and PD2.

- o If a student scores higher than 80% on the pre-diagnostic, he or she is not required to take the post-diagnostic at the end of the semester.
- o If a student does not score an 80% or higher on the prediagnostic, he or she will take the post-diagnostic.
- If a student does not score an 80% or higher on the postdiagnostic,
 - the student will be required to present proof of online review session attendance of T-Cert in order to receive TExES exam approval.
 - the student will be invited to attend a TExES review session for the PPR or content exam area with UHD faculty, Region IV, or the Harris County Department of Education.

UHD-CPDT TEXES Exams

- PD1 teacher candidates meeting criteria will take the TExES PPR following PD1.
- PD2 teacher candidates meeting criteria will take the TExES content exam following PD2.
- Approval to register for exams is contingent upon successful block completion, faculty recommendation, and completion of the pre-and post-diagnostic experiences.
- Based on approval, exams can be taken at the end of the semester (or at the beginning of the following semester) in which the content and methodology are taught. TExES exams are currently \$120.
- Rationale
 - Gives teacher candidates the opportunity to be successful on the TExES exams soon after completing coursework in content and methodology
 - Gives teacher candidates the opportunity to pass all TExES exams prior to student teaching

Teacher Loan Forgiveness - Eligibility

Borrower must:

- Teach full-time for five consecutive, complete academic years in a low-income elementary or secondary school listed in the Department's Directory of Low-Income Schools
- Teaching at an eligible elementary or secondary school may be counted toward the 5-year period only if at least one year was after the 1997-98 AY

Teacher Loan Forgiveness - Eligibility

- If the qualifying service began on or after 10/30/2004, a borrower may:
 - Receive up to \$5,000 forgiveness for:
 - Service as a highly-qualified full-time elementary or secondary school teacher
- If the 5 year period began on or after 10/30/2004, a borrower may:
 - Receive up to \$17,500 forgiveness for:
 - Service as a highly-qualified math or science teacher in an eligible secondary school, or
 - Service as a highly-qualified special education teacher of children with disabilities, and the disabilities correspond to borrower's area of training, and the borrower has demonstrated knowledge and skills in curriculum content taught
