ALL CHILDREN ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW THESE THREE SIMPLE RULES AT ALL TIMES IN ALL AREAS OF THE SCHOOL. OUR STUDENTS WILL BE INSTRUCTED IN EXPECTED BEHAVIORS BY THEIR CLASSROOM TEACHERS. THESE BEHAVIORS WILL BE MODELED AND PRACTICED OFTEN AND IN AGE APPROPRIATE WAYS.

The Rewards

All children will be recognized for exhibiting expected behaviors by earning tickets or Class Dojo points which will be passed out frequently by all adults in the school. Our Flyers will collect these tickets and once they have received ten they will be able to trade them for privileges in the classroom. These privileges may include sitting with a friend in class, reading a book to a younger student, bringing a small stuffed animal to school for the day, among many, many others. Any child that has received ten tickets five different times will be recognized as a Gold Star Flyer and receive their picture on the wall and a certificate of excellence.

Whole Class incentives will be earned in the form of Sky Miles. Any time an entire class is on task or shows other appropriate behaviors, they will receive a Sky Mile. Once one hundred miles, (fifty for kindergarten and seventy-five for first grade), are earned the class will have a Travel Treat. They will choose a country or state to learn about and then participate in fun activities related to their destination. These may include an origami project for Japan, a class soccer game for Brazil, high tea for Great Britain, or any other number of things.

Redirection

Any time a rule is broken the student will receive a reminder in the form of his or her name being written on the board. Each child may receive up to two reminders with NO consequences. For many children this redirection is enough to get back on track. Upon the third reminder a consequence is put into place. Most of the time this will be in the form of a silent lunch. Other consequences may be put into place at the teacher's discretion. You will be informed that evening in the form of a Yellow Note which will be in your child's take home folder. This is sent home because we value your support as parents and we also believe in the importance of communication. We ask that you discuss the incident with your child and encourage him or her to do better the next day. All Yellow Notes must be signed and returned the following school day.

Occasionally there may be an incident that is so serious in nature that no warnings are given before a Yellow Note is immediately sent home or parents immediately called. This may be done at the teacher's discretion. This may also result in an office referral if the teacher feels administration should get involved.

LEADERSHIP LEARNING ACADEMY DISMISSAL POLICY

In an effort to keep your children safe, we have the following procedures for dismissal.

Children who walk or bike home, or are picked up at the church, will be required have a signed permission slip in order to do so. The form is on our website and must be signed and turned into the child's homeroom teacher before the child will be allowed to go off campus.

Children that leave the campus may either walk home or walk to the church to be picked up. No child will be allowed to wait along the fence to be picked up.

All other children are required to wait with their class only. They will not be allowed to wait by the flag pole, with a sibling, with a car pool group, or at any other spot. Weather permitting, children are required to sit to wait. Parents/car pool pick up are required to place a sign in the front of their vehicle stating the name of their children and their clusters. This will help the process move quickly.

Parents are still allowed to park and walk up to get their children. They may walk up to the designated class waiting space to pick up their children. All parents and students are required to use the school crosswalk and are not allowed to cross through the carpool lane.

We believe these policies will ensure the safety and well-being of your child. As always, we appreciate your support in this, and in all matters, as partners in the education of your children.

DRESS CODE

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Dress Code Policy is to promote school unity and instill a safe learning environment of equality, discipline and self-respect. It is the responsibility of all parents and students at Leadership Learning Academy to read, understand and comply with the terms of this Policy.

SHIRTS

- Shirts must be solid colored light blue, navy blue, or white with or without authorized school logo (no teal, aqua, denim or other shades of blue are permitted).
- Shirts must have a collar (full turtlenecks are acceptable as a "collared shirt").
- Shirts can be long or short sleeved.
- Layering with a shirt underneath is permitted as long as the under layer is either solid white or blue.
- Logos, embroidery or embellishments of any kind are not permitted. Notwithstanding the preceding prohibition, authorized school logos may be worn on shirts.
- Shirts must be long enough to cover midriff.

SWEATERS AND VESTS

- Must be either solid blue or white with or without authorized school logo.
- No hoods allowed in classroom.

BOTTOMS

- All bottoms must be a solid colored khaki or navy blue.
- Jumpers, skirts, skorts and capris are allowed but must be knee length.
- Collared dresses in navy or khaki may be worn.
- Sweatpants, exercise pants, overalls or short shorts are not permitted.
- Denim jeans are not permitted on normal dress days.

JACKETS

- Jackets must be a solid colored light blue, navy blue or white with or without a hood to be worn in the classroom. Hoods cannot be worn in the school.
 - Jackets that are not uniform colors can only be worn outside of the school.
- School hoodies are allowed in the classroom.

ACCESSORIES

- Shoes must be "closed toe."
- Socks or stockings are required and must be solid navy or white.
- No hats are permitted.
- No makeup is permitted.
- Hair must be neat and not distracting.
- Ties are permitted.
- Jewelry should be limited and not distracting.

GENERAL POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- Clothing must be neat and in good condition. Rips, tears and large stains are not permitted.
- A "Free Dress Day" is a regular school day when various provisions of this Dress Code Policy will not be enforced. Free Dress Day standards will be determined by the Campus Principal and parents will be notified of proper Free Dress Day attire.

Friday Causal Dress

Students are permitted to wear jeans (shorts, capris, skirts, long jeans) and uniform tops on Fridays only (no holes or rips in clothing please). All other dress code policies apply.

\$ Dress Down Day

In exchange for the opportunity to “dress down” (wear non dress code attire), students donate \$1 directly to the school. This is a simple, fun way for LLA families to support our school.

Dress Down Fundraiser Days will occur once each month; usually on the last Friday. Students are permitted to dress in casual clothing, provided they follow the general clothing provisions of the Dress Code Policy as outlined in the LLA School Handbook.

- These provisions include:
- Tank tops, tube tops, spaghetti straps and bare midriff shirts may not be worn
- Shoes must be closed toe and closed heel
- No hats
- On Dress Down Fundraiser Days, clothing should be neat, well kept, and practical for school.

- Please be sure to send \$1.00 with your child on designated Fridays (please do not send money prior) in an envelope which states your child's name and teacher's name if you choose to dress down. They will give this money to their teacher

STAY HOME WHEN SICK!

- CHECK THEIR CHILD FOR SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 EVERY DAY BEFORE SCHOOL
- IF THEIR CHILD HAS A TEMPERATURE OF 100.4° F (38° C) OR HIGHER, THE CHILD HAS A FEVER
- KEEP THEIR CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL IF HE OR SHE FEELS SICK OR HAS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19
- FOLLOW THE QUARANTINE GUIDANCE IF THEIR CHILD OR ANYONE WHO LIVES IN THEIR HOME IS EXPOSED TO SOMEONE WITH COVID-19
- BEFORE THE SCHOOL YEAR STARTS, TELL THE SCHOOL IF THEIR CHILD HAS A HEALTH CONDITION THAT PUTS HIM OR HER AT A HIGHER RISK FOR SEVERE ILLNESS FROM COVID-19
- THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL CALL PARENTS OF STUDENTS WHO ARE AT HIGHER RISK FOR SEVERE ILLNESS FROM COVID-19 IF THEY ARE EXPOSED AT THE SCHOOL.
- REVIEW AND UPDATE THEIR CHILD'S PLANS
- HELP THEIR CHILD CLEAN HIS OR HER CLOTH FACE COVERING OR MASK DAILY
