
Scholarship to College



REFLECTING ON THE FIRST READING

FIRST READING: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

The Book of Job is a theological statement about the issue of innocent human suffering.

The book begins with the question: Are God's people only faithful to him because of the blessings they receive? Would they remain faithful if God withdrew his blessings? Satan raises the question and God uses Job as a test case. When the prosperous and just Job is suddenly afflicted by the death of his family, loss of wealth, and personal illness, a series of "friends" argue that Job's misfortunes must be a punishment for some sin. Job refuses to accept this traditional explanation of why "bad things happen to good people." Today's reading represents Job's response to one of his so-called "comforters." He rejects their shallow explanation of his misery. Job reflects not only on his own pain but also on the suffering of all innocent people. He gives voice to the sentiments that many people feel at a time of suffering: Life is futile. It has no meaning. Is not man's life on earth drudgery? The sooner death comes along, the better. Why doesn't God speak to me? God's silence and seeming absence is also a part of our suffering. (God does speak in chapter 40.) Job's lament is a "complaint of the righteous." We need to know that it is okay for us to complain to God about the circumstances of our lives. (Ascensioncatholic.net)




Our Lady of Lourdes

Feast day February 11

Each year over 2 million people make their way through the mountainous country of southeastern France to Lourdes. They come seeking cures, hoping to find answers, believing, and praying. At Lourdes, people recall the Lady dressed in white, with blue sash, yellow roses at her feet, and a Rosary on her arm—the Blessed Virgin Mary.

On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous. This was the first of 18 visits, many of them with 20,000 people present. When Bernadette asked the Lady's identity, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Just four years earlier, the pope had proclaimed it a dogma that Mary was conceived immaculate without original sin. The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart. Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also instructed Bernadette to tell the priests that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held.

On February 25, 1858, the Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. Bernadette began to dig, and after several attempts she was able to find the water to drink. The water continued to flow from where she had dug with her hands until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day—as it still does. There have been over 5,000 cures recorded but less than 100 of them have been declared miraculous by the Church. Most of these have taken place during the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.

Today we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. We may never travel to Lourdes and join in the processions, but we can know always that we have a Mother to help us and lead us to her Son, Jesus. (Loyolapress.com)

And so we pray to her:

Grant us, O merciful God, protection in our weakness, that we, who keep the Memorial of the Immaculate Mother of God, may, with the help of her intercession, rise up from our iniquities. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever. (Collect Prayer from the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes)



Saint Joseph

The husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus is often said to be a "carpenter." In fact, he was a *tekton*, a more general term of his time for someone who works in construction. (It shares the same root as "technology.") As such, Joseph would have been more of a general contractor, working with iron or stone as well as wood. In fact, some scholars think he might have even worked on major Roman construction projects in Sepphoris, a larger city about three and a half miles from Nazareth, where the Holy Family lived.

We do know that Joseph was a good man who took his responsibility of caring for Jesus and Mary seriously. He said yes to this awesome responsibility and did not hesitate to move his family to keep them safe. Celebrate St. Joseph on March 19 by asking for his care and protection of your family this day and always.
