


Figure 2b. State-by-State Projected Percent Change from Class of 2019 to 2037, Grand Total of Public & Private Schools



MI: -15% projected change in HS Grads from 2019 to 2037





Rising Tuition Costs








Declining Student Credit Hours



Enrolled Student Residency




Retention and Graduation Rates

6-yr Graduation Rates (2009-2015 cohorts)




First Time in Any College Second Year Retention Rate

Retention and Graduation Rates

Strategies to Date

- Midterm grade reporting (>2x in past 4 years)
- "Intrusive" academic advising/student success
- DEWI in 6 STEM Gateway Courses (G2C Initiative)
- Undergraduate Completion Scholarships
 - ~200 \$4K scholarships awarded from 2017-18 to 2019-20
 - 92% of recipients have now graduated



Retention and Graduation Rates

Future Opportunities?

- DEWI beyond STEM gateways, especially focused on equity gaps
- Departmental first year seminars
- Promoting a welcoming and inclusive culture
- Increased investment in undergraduate need-based financial aid
 - CAS will award >\$150K in undergraduate completion scholarships this year
- Investment in teaching technology (\$100K)
- Space and infrastructure improvements (\$100K)
- Laptop refresh for faculty and staff (\$225K)




Dunbar Renovation



- \$42.7M (\$30M from state)
- 90,900 sq feet


Inclusive Faculty Hiring

ASPIRE-IChange Inclusive Hiring Recommendations

- Dean-level hiring approval requires explicit DEI plans
- Inclusive job ad language, highlighting WMU & CAS commitment to DEI
- Required DEI statement from candidates
- Use of standard rubrics to evaluate candidates
- Intentional & broad recruiting
- Inclusive interview practices
- Consider demographic data of potential pool to ensure candidate pools are representative


