




Revised §553.2003

HHSC Long-term Care Regulation has published **revised** <u>COVID-19 Response</u> <u>Expansion of Reopening Visitation</u> <u>Emergency Rules (PDF)</u>, for assisted living facilities.

The rules were updated to specify that visitors under the age of 2 are exempt from all requirements related to wearing masks.

Update on Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

DSHS is recommending that vaccine providers in Texas **resume** administering the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine following the <u>recommendation</u> from the CDC and FDA.



CDC Guidance for Fully Vaccinated People

CDC updated guidance:

- Non-healthcare settings <u>Interim</u> <u>Public Health Recommendations for</u> <u>Fully Vaccinated People</u>
- Healthcare settings <u>Updated</u> <u>Healthcare Infection Prevention and</u> <u>Control Recommendations in</u> <u>Response to COVID-19 Vaccination</u>



Vaccination Reporting

Providers **must** report COVID-19 vaccination data for residents and staff to HHSC within 24 hours of the vaccinations.

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HHSC expects providers to report **all** known data, no matter where the vaccine was administered or who administered it.



Vaccination Reporting

<Continued>

A facility that is aware of unreported resident or staff vaccinations must enter those into the survey by April 20, 2021.

Failure to report known vaccinations may result in a citation from HHSC. This supersedes previous guidance.

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Vaccination Reporting

<Continued>

For example, the facility must report if:

- The facility hosted a vaccine clinic on site for residents or staff.
- The facility transported residents or staff to an offsite location such as a pharmacy, doctor's office, or vaccine hub for vaccination.
- Individual residents or staff were transported, by family or private transportation, to an offsite location for vaccination.

Enroll in NHSN COVID-19 Module

HHSC has published the <u>National</u> <u>Healthcare Safety Network Long Term</u> <u>Care Facility COVID-19 Module</u> <u>Enrollment (PDF)</u>. The letter explains who can report into the NHSN COVID-19 module including ALFs.

Enrolling in the NHSN COVID-19 module provides LTC facilities with a secure reporting platform.

Health and Human Services The NHSN reporting system has fewer system requirements than the DSHS system. Some providers may prefer its user interface.

When to Quarantine Residents and Staff

Quarantine decision trees for ALF residents and staff available for download in Handout section.

Help you determine when to quarantine residents and staff based on:

- Previous recovery from COVID-19 within the last 90 days
- Vaccination status

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Symptomatic/asymptomatic status

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*Higher-risk exposure means prolonged exposure (a cumulative 15 or more minutes during a 24-hour period) to residents with COVID-19 infection when the staff member's eyes, nose, or mouth are not covered.

Fully vaccinated staff with higher-risk exposure* **do not** have to be restricted from work for 14 days following exposure if they are asymptomatic.

Vaccinated Staff

CDC Guidance updated March 10.

Staffing Shortage due to COVID-19

CDC <u>guidance</u> allows asymptomatic, fully vaccinated staff who are not known to be infected to continue working provided:

- Staff should report temperature and absence of symptoms each day before starting work (i.e., staff screening).
- Staff should be tested and, if found to be infected with COVID-19, should be excluded from work until they meet all <u>Return to Work Criteria</u>.

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When to Quarantine Residents

For **asymptomatic residents**, quarantine is **no longer** recommended for residents who are being admitted to an ALF if they are:

fully vaccinated and

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
 have NOT had prolonged <u>close</u> <u>contact</u> with someone with COVID-19 in the prior 14 days.

When to Quarantine Residents

<Continued>

This updated quarantine guidance applies to:

- new admissions,
- readmissions, and
- residents who have gone overnight as long as the resident **DID NOT** have prolonged close contact with someone with a COVID-19 infection.



Revised ALF Visitation Guidance (PL 2021-12)

HHSC LTCR published <u>Provider Letter</u> 2021-12 (replaces PL 20- 42 and PL 20-23) COVID-19 Response – Expansion of Reopening Visitation (PDF).



The letter clarifies COVID-19 visitation flexibilities permitted by newly revised <u>ALF Expansion of Reopening Visitation</u> <u>Emergency Rules (PDF)</u>.

Visitation Rules

The rules:

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 allow for less restrictive visitation once a facility has offered* a complete series of COVID vaccines to residents and staff and documented each resident's choice to vaccinate or not. See §553.2003(g).

*Note – *offer* in this context means to administer, arrange/assist, **OR** educate/give information about the COVID-19 vaccine **AND** documented the resident's choice.

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Visitation Rules

<Continued> The rules:

 allow for more restrictive visitation if a facility has NOT made this offer* to residents and staff. See §553.2003(h).

*Note – offer in this context means to administer, arrange/assist, **OR** educate/give information about the COVID-19 vaccine **AND** documented the resident's choice.



Has the facility administered, arranged, **or** given information about the COVID-19 vaccine **and** documented resident's choice?

Yes – less restrictive visitation rules §553.2003(g) **No** – More restrictive visitation rules §553.2003(h)



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Less Restrictive Visitation

- No attestation form for visitation is required.
- A resident may choose to have close or personal contact with their visitor during the visit.
- There may be up to two permanently designated essential caregivers per resident and up to two designated essential caregivers may visit the resident at the same time.

More Restrictive Visitation

- There may be up to two permanently designated essential caregivers per resident and <u>one</u> designated EC may visit at a time.
- Submit LTCR Form 2196 to the Regional Director. If approved, the facility must allow for outdoor visits, open window visits, vehicle parades and indoor plexiglass visits involving residents and personal visitors. If previously submitted and no changes, do not resubmit.
- A facility must receive an approved visitation designation before it can begin permitting outdoor visits, indoor plexiglass visits, open window visits and vehicle parades.

§553.2003(h)

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Applicable to All Visitation

- TEXAS Health and Human Services
- A facility must not require a visitor to provide documentation of COVID-19 negative test or COVID-19 vaccination status as a condition of visitation or to enter a facility.



Applicable to All Visitation

<Continued>

Masks:

- Visitors and essential caregivers must wear masks at all times. Per CDC, children 2 years of age or younger do not have to wear a mask.
- Residents must wear masks at all times (if tolerated). If the resident does not tolerate wearing a mask, the facility documents in the resident record.

Applicable to All Visitation

<Continued>

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- Scheduling: Schedule visitation appointments to allow time for cleaning and sanitization of the visitation area between visits.
- Screening: Screen all visitors according to requirements.

All ALF EC Visits

- EC visits allowed for all residents with any COVID-19 status.
- Resident must wear facemask, if tolerated. Resident may remove mask to eat or drink during visit.
- EC must wear mask throughout the visit. EC may not eat or drink during visit.
- No EC testing or testing strategy required.
- No staff escorting to/from EC visits.

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ALF Visitation Comparison

HHSC LTCR published <u>Visitation</u> <u>Comparison Table (PDF)</u> for ALFs.

The table can be used as a tool to help providers determine the visitation requirements for those providers who have offered the COVID-19 vaccine and those who have not.

The next slides review the visitation comparison table.



Visitation Comparison

	Offered vaccine and documented resident's choice	Has not offered vaccine and documented choice
Essential Caregiver (EC) Visits	Allowed for all residents with any COVID status.	
Number of EC Visitors	Up to 2 EC can visit a resident at the same time.	Only 1 EC can visit a resident at a time.
End-of-Life (EOL) Visits	Allowed for all residents with any COVID status.	
Screening	Screen all visitors except emergency personnel.	
Facemask	 All visitors must wear facemask at all times while in the facility. Per CDC, children 2 years or younger do not need to wear a mask. Residents must wear facemasks, if tolerated. Document if not tolerated. 	



Visitation Comparison

	Offered vaccine and documented resident's choice	Has not offered vaccine and documented choice
Indoor and Outdoor Visits	Allowed for residents with COVID-negative status.	 With HHSC approval (Attestation Form 2196), the following are allowed for COVID-negative residents: open window visits,
		 vehicle parades, outdoor visits, and plexiglass indoor visits
Physical Contact	Allowed for EC, EOL, and	Allowed only for EC and
between residents	visits with COVID-	EOL visits.

Salon Services	Only for residents with COVID-negative status.	

Vaccine Refusal

If the COVID vaccines were "offered" but not accepted by residents, does our facility meet the criteria of having "offered" the vaccine?

Yes, as long as the facility has documented each resident's choice to vaccinate or not to vaccinate.





Difference Between Essential Caregiver and Visitor

What is the major difference between an Essential Caregiver and a visitor?

- EC = resident can be COVIDpositive, COVID-negative, COVIDunknown
- Visitor = resident must be COVIDnegative

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Number of Visitors

The number of visitors that can visit a resident at a time is not defined in rule.

- Limited by scheduling and size of visitation area
- No physical distancing necessary among visitors in the same group
- ECs can visit with another group of personal visitors (for COVID-negative residents)

Entertainers

Entertainers may come to the facility provided they:

- Pass screening prior to entry.
- Wear a facemask at all times in the facility.
- Maintain physical distance of 6-10 ft from audience.

Remember:

- COVID cohorts cannot mingle together.
- Performance area must be sanitized after use and if used for different cohorts, sanitize between each performance.



Transportation to Outings

Facility sponsored outings are allowed, but residents must maintain physical distancing, which may limit how many are in the vehicle at one time.

TEXAS Health and Human Services Residents and staff must wear masks. Hand hygiene must take place as well.

Dining and Activities

Dining and activities are acceptable within resident cohorts, but the residents must maintain physical distancing, regardless of vaccination status.

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Facility Tours

An ALF may allow in-person tours for a potential resident. The following would apply to in-person tours:

- limit in-person tours to COVID negative areas of the building
- ensure all tour visitors wear masks
- ensure all tour visitors maintain physical distancing between themselves and all staff, residents, and other visitors

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Facility Tours

<Continued>

An ALF may allow in-person tours for a potential resident. The following would apply to in-person tours:

- limit in-person tour groups to not more than three persons
- schedule all in-person tours in advance

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Salon Services

Salon service visits are permitted for residents with COVID-negative status:

- Visit may occur outdoors, in resident's bedroom, or another area that limits visitor movement
- Salon service visitor must wear facemask.
- Resident must wear facemask, if tolerated.

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 Testing strategy for salon services visitors.

Revised PL 2020-49

HHSC revises guidance allowing LTC providers to use free COVID-19 POC antigen tests on anyone.

Provider Letter 2020-49 (Revised) Process to Request Free COVID-19 Point of Care Antigen Test Kits

The revised letter expands the ability of LTC providers to use the requested free BinaxNOW COVID-19 point of care antigen test kits on anyone.



Free BinaxNOW COVID-19 POC Tests Available for LTC Providers

Providers must attest to adhere to certain training and reporting requirements and have one of the following.

- Current Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendment Certificate of Waiver
- Current CLIA laboratory certificate

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Complete and submit an attestation form for free BinaxNOW point-of-care antigen COVID-19 test kits (PDF) to request free BinaxNOW COVID-19 point of care test kits. See revised PL 2020-49 (PDF) for more information. Tests are available while supplies last.



Vaccine Eligibility

As of Monday, March 29, 2021, **everyone age 16 and older** is now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine in Texas.



Texas Public Health Vaccine Scheduler

Visit the DSHS <u>Texas Public Health</u> <u>Vaccine Scheduler</u> to sign up for the COVID vaccine.

Call (833) 832-7067 if you don't have internet or need help signing up.

Spanish language and other translators are available to help callers.



Where to Get Vaccinated

If you're eligible to get vaccinated now, you can check with a large vaccination hub and/or a local vaccine provider, like a nearby pharmacy or your doctor.

Find Vaccine:

- **1. LARGE VACCINATION HUBS**
- 2. VACCINE AVAILABILITY MAP
- 3. LIST OF ALL PROVIDERS

When searching for a vaccination site, remember:

- Vaccine supply is limited. Not all local providers have vaccine each week and hubs may have long waiting lists.
- Do not show up at a hub or provider looking for a vaccine.
- Instead, check the provider's website. Call only if the website doesn't answer your questions.



Authorized and Recommended Vaccines

The CDC provides information on who is and is not recommended to receive each vaccine and what to expect after vaccination, as well as ingredients, safety, and effectiveness.

Currently, three vaccines are authorized and recommended to prevent COVID-19:

• <u>Pfizer</u>

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- <u>Moderna</u>
- Janssen

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Vaccine Allergic Reaction

The CDC provides recommendations on what to do if you experience an allergic reaction after getting a COVID-19 vaccination. It also provides recommendations for people who have had allergic reactions to other vaccines and for those with other types of allergies.

Management of Anaphylaxis after COVID-19 Vaccination

These interim considerations provide recommendations on assessment and management of anaphylaxis following COVID-19 vaccination.

Reporting Vaccine Reactions

The Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS) is co-managed by the CDC and the FDA. VAERS accepts and analyzes reports of adverse events (possible side effects) following vaccination.

Use VAERS to report adverse reactions to the COVID vaccine, which are very rare.

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

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- Vaccination Status of Residents -Residents must be treated with respect and dignity, not separated or treated differently by vaccination status.
- Vaccination Status of Visitors A visitor is not required to inform you of their vaccination status. Whether a visitor is vaccinated or not does not affect their visitation.
