CAREER RESOURCE CENTER


- Over 600 freshmen attended workshops focused on values this past year.
- Conduct over 9,000 on-campus interviews annually
- Have a database of 20,000 employers recruiting at UF
- Average 1100 job postings each month for new jobs
- Secure nearly 200 new employers recruiting at UF annually
- Host 7 on-campus fairs such as the Part-Time Job Fair (September) and the Summer Job & Internship Fair and promote 47 virtual fairs.

CRC ranked #1 for best career resources by <u>The Princeton Review</u> for 2010 and 2012; in the top five since the inception of the ranking system.

Greek Life:

- The all-Greek GPA continues to be higher than the overall UF GPA 3.31 vs. 3.29
- 65% of 2013-2014 Hall of Fame inductees are Greek
- At Dance Marathon, Greek students raised \$995,301.20 for the Children's Miracle Network (\$2 million total)
- At All Greek Service Day, Greeks contributed 852 hours of service (in one day!) across Gainesville and Alachua County
- Travel and Recreation Program (TRiP)
- TRiP is an outdoor recreation and education program that specializes in student-led wilderness excursions.

Student Organizations:

- Over 1000 active registered student organizations.
- 3553 students hold leadership positions within these organizations
- The average student organization president's GPA is 3.44, higher than the overall UF GPA
- SAI Involvement Team did 511 individual involvement consultations during 2013 Preview. This resulted in 464 student organization memberships within their first year at UF.
- 84.61% of these students say they found a UF community with which they felt they belonged within one month of starting classes.

- 700 student employees

Housing and Residence Education

- During the 2014-15 academic year, campus residents were engaged in over 2,000 programs. Attendance at all programs was over 28,500.
- Occupancy: Over 8,100 students are housed in UF residence halls.
- Staffing: 350 full-time staff and 435 part-time staff including students work for UF Housing.
- Why Live On Campus? Current research indicates that students who live in residence halls --even just for one year -- have higher levels of satisfaction with their collegiate experience, have higher GPAs and higher levels of engagement and learning outside of the classroom.
- Facilities: UF Housing staff maintain 159 buildings totalling 2,932, 307 square feet.



MULTICULTURAL AND DIVERSITY AFFAIRS

- Ambassador Program 120 students work and/or volunteer as part of the MCDA Ambassador Program across 5 areas: Asian Pacific Islander American Affairs, Institute of Black Culture, Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures, Intercultural Engagement, and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Affairs. Great leadership and skill development opportunity!
- Physical Spaces Three Locations: Peabody Hall, Institute of Black Culture, Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures
 - Two Institutes located on University Ave (near Chipotle) provide free meeting space, lounge space, programming, and SG-financed free printing for all students.
 - The 4th floor of Peabody Hall houses the Rainbow Room and APIA Resource Room
- Gatorship an intense and thought-provoking weekend retreat during which over 60 participants and student staff have the opportunity to engage with a diverse group of peers across issues of difference. Has impacted 2000+ students over its 10 years at UF. Great way to get involved!
- University Minority Mentor Program (UMMP) open to any firstyear incoming student who identifies as non-white or first generation or low income of any race/ethnicity.
 - The previous year included 172 Faculty/Staff Mentors and 228 Mentees (first year students). Applications for new students go live around July 1, 2014.

- The University of Florida Police Department (UFPD) has 89 sworn law enforcement officers whose mission is to preserve a safe, secure campus environment where diverse social, cultural and academic values are allowed to develop and prosper through a combination of reactive, proactive and educational law enforcement services.
- One of the largest in the country
- Accredited by 3 different associations



New Educational Initiative for All Incoming Students

- Beginning this summer,, UF will be requiring all incoming students to complete Campus Clarity's Think About It program.
- Think About It is a 2 ½ hour online educational program that will provide information on the laws of the State of Florida and UF policies on sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence and stalking as well as information on alcohol and its relationship to these issues.
- It will also provide information on how students can help friends and be an active bystander to prevent these behaviors from occurring., consistent with our culture of care message.
- Students will need to complete this online seminar before they can register for classes for after their first semester. For example, students starting in the fall will need to complete the seminar before they can register for Spring classes.

RAPE AGGRESSION DEFENSE (R.A.D)

- R.A.D. is a self-defense program designed specifically for women. The R.A.D.
 approach to personal safety begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction and risk avoidance, and progresses to hands-on physical defense
- There were 18 classes, hosting 483 women in 2014.





STUDENT NIGHTTIME AUXILIARY PATROL (SNAP)

 SNAP is a free, nightly, campus safety and transportation service providing a point-topoint vehicular escort service.

In 2014 126,551 escorts were provided by SNAP staff.



CENTER FOR LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE

- MentorUF: 445 UF students participate in 1on-1 and group mentoring in local elementary, middle, and high schools
- Summer Plunge, Gator Plunge, and MLK Days of Service: 885 UF students participate in service projects over these days of service while connecting social issues in Gainesville
- Florida Alternative Breaks: Over 200 UF students travel around Florida, the southeast and internationally to learn more about social issues and provide service to communities
- Conferences: Students can attend the Servant Leader Institute, Innovation Academy Servant Leader Series, Greater Gator Conference, or the Gator Global Initiative to learn more about leadership and social issues




UF graduates continue leading through service after graduation. UF ranks nationally in producing volunteers for Peace Corps (#3) and Teach for America (#5).

 GatorWell's Wellness Coaching for Academic Success is particularly useful to students with 96% indicating they were satisfied with their Wellness Coaching sessions and 95% indicating they would recommend the service to other UF students.

The GatorWell Health Hut Program reached 6,218 students last year; 96% of students indicated their interactions at the Health Hut were valuable to them OR 83% indicated they learned something new they would implement in the future.

 Over 14,600 students attended one of GatorWell's health-related presentations; 94% were satisfied with the presentation and 90% found the health topic relevant to them.

UF LIBRARIES

- The libraries of the University of Florida form the largest information resource system in the state of Florida.
- The UF Libraries consist of seven libraries; six are in the system known as the George A. Smathers Libraries
- and the seventh is the Legal Information Center at the Levin College of Law.
- The libraries have built nationally significant research collections in Latin America, Judaica, and Floridiana to name a few.
- The University of Florida Digital Collections (UFDC) contain over 385,763 items, representing 125,394 different titles, and new materials are being added every day.
