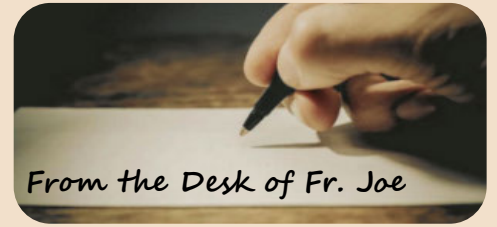

Dear Parishioners,

As Catholics, we dedicate the month of November to all the poor souls. Sometimes, you may notice the Mass intention for the day is for poor souls. However, who are these poor souls, and why do we devote part of our year to them?



Poor souls are those who have left this earth and are now in purgatory. They are considered “poor” in that they cannot *merit their own release or mitigation of their sufferings, but depend on the prayers and good works of the faithful on earth* (Catholic Culture). You will also notice that we offer up every Mass for the faithful departed, as well. It is at the Holy Mass that the Church is united- the Church Militant (those of us on earth), the Church Suffering (the poor souls in purgatory,) and the Church Triumphant (those already in Heaven.) When we remember this, we have the opportunity to experience true joy.

Most Protestants (and even some Catholics) do not believe that purgatory is a real place, as it is not mentioned in the Bible. However, there are a few places we read of others praying for the dead. (Look up 2 Maccabees 12:39-45 and 2 Timothy 1:15-18 to read about it). Jesus also talks about our life here and after we leave earth in Matthew 12:32. Purgatory is not hell, nor does it mean we cannot enter heaven. It is here that we are purified in order to *achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven* (CCC 1030).

In today’s Gospel, we learn of true sacrificial giving. While the rich men of the community were throwing in large sums of money, a poor little woman comes forward with two small coins. Jesus recognized that this woman held nothing back from her fixed income- that was most of her wages. Yet, the rich men only “skimmed off” from *the surplus* they made. They withheld much. What we gather from this Gospel passage is that this lady took this small amount in order to give to something greater. It was not the money that mattered- it was her generous heart and total trust to God. What a wonderful testament to putting complete faith and trust into the hand of the Lord.

As we remember those who have gone before us, let us also remember our own life on this earth. We will be reminded on our judgment day how we lived- how did we use our wealth, talents, and our time to the Glory of God? How did we prepare ourselves and our families for heaven? Take this opportunity- NOW- to commit to the Lord, and strive and work to live a life of holiness. Ask for His guidance in walking in His ways, and He will grant it to you. Also pray for your loved ones who have left before you, so that you may be reunited in Heaven. As the prayers go up, the blessings will come down.

Vocation or Calling

Question:

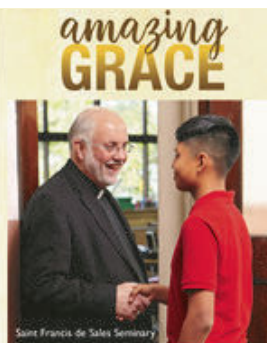
Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?



Answer:

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.

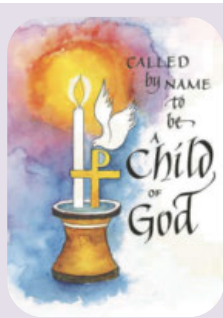

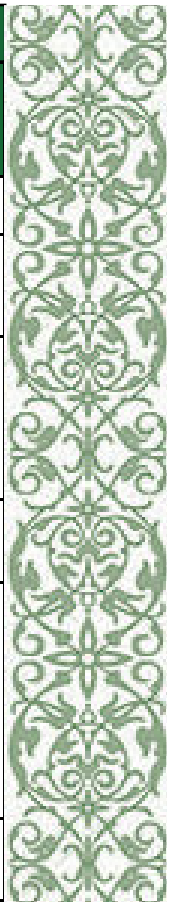

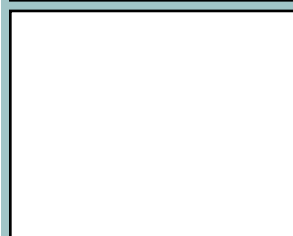
