

MISSION WATCH: DODGERTOWN TUTORING. Community Church has a long history of tutoring children at Dodgertown Elementary School in Vero Beach. Prior to the disruption caused by Covid-19, 14 volunteer tutors, coordinated by Richard Lanam, worked with teachers and groups of students to facilitate their learning. Unable to work in the school during Covid, several tutors began working with Crossover Mission as mentors. As the schools re-open in the fall, we will be seeking volunteers to resume tutoring students directly. Community Church people help children grow and thrive in their schools through this important mission.
