WHY A SPECIAL PREPARATION FOR CONFIRMATION?

Sacramental catechesis is a total process of faith development that includes growth in personal prayer, intense involvement in a faith community (which includes community, worship, service, and message), and deepened commitment to the Church. This catechetical process involves not only the individuals who are preparing to celebrate the Sacrament, but also their families and the entire parish community.

"Preparation for Confirmation should aim at leading the Christian toward a more intimate union with Christ and a more lively familiarity with the Holy Spirit – his actions, his gifts, and his biddings---in order to be more capable of assuming the apostolic responsibilities of Christian life. To this end catechesis for Confirmation should strive to awaken a sense of belonging to the Church of Jesus Christ, the universal Church as well as the parish community. The latter bears special responsibility for the preparation of confirmands." (CCC - Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1309)

Therefore, your Confirmation candidate will be exposed to:

- Increased prayer and worship opportunities with the parish community.
- Mentors, guides, and witnesses from the parish.
- Community-building activities that give the candidates a sense of belonging to their parish community.
- Special activities and celebration of rituals with parish liturgies that alert the parishioners to their role as supporters of those to be confirmed.
- Prayer partners from the parish.
- Invitations to assume responsibility in the ministry and service aspects of parish life.
- Study of the gifts and fruits of the Spirit.
- An understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the individual and of the Church.
- Study of the Sacrament of Baptism where we first received the Spirit.
- Study of the ritual of Confirmation with its symbols and Scripture readings about the Spirit.
- Time for prayer, reflection, and discussion on the presence and working of the Spirit in our lives.

PIECES OF THE PUZZLES



The following is a list of certain "pieces" which "make-up" the Confirmation program "puzzle." They are intended to help each teen develop a commitment to faith and prepare for life ahead.

1. Prayer Life – Đời Sống Cầu Nguyên

The candidates are encouraged to deepen their relationship with Christ though their regular personal prayers, meditations, Bible readings, and family prayers. It is strongly encouraged that Confirmation Candidates and family members attend Eucharistic Adoration every Friday night through Saturday morning in the Church.

2. Liturgy and Rites - Phụng Vụ và Các Nghi Thức

At the center of the Catholic Christian faith is the celebration of the Eucharist, the real presence of Christ in the bread and wine. It is at the Eucharistic Liturgy, where we come together with all of our Catholic Christian friends to celebrate as one church.

A mandatory component of the Confirmation Program is weekly mass attendance. All candidates are encouraged to attend Youth Mass which is held on Sunday at 5:00PM.

"Rites" mark important steps of the faith journey toward Confirmation. These Celebations are shared with loved ones and those in our parish community.

3. Confirmation Retreats – Tinh Tâm Thêm Sức

Retreats are such an important part of the Confirmation process; they are even important in life. Retreats are intended to give people the chance to "get away" from things that are not allowing them to focus. Confirmation Retreats allow the teens to go away to play, to pray, but more importantly, to deepen their love in Christ through fellowship, praise and reflection. When you return from these retreats, you can be guaranteed that your life will be changed.

The 3 days WEEKEND RETREAT is MANDATORY for reception of Confirmation. If you are unable to attend your own assigned retreat, contact Faith Formation Office in advance to locate a parish with a retreat that you can attend.

Confirmation Workshops – Hôi Thảo Thêm Sức

In small and large groups setting, Confirmation workshops are designed to explore basic Catholic faith and to study the life of Jesus Christ. Workshops will be interactive, informative, at times extremely fun, prayerful and different. This large group workshop has special speakers with unique presentations. All workshops should be attended. If you cannot attend, vou must contact RE office in advance. Excessive absences (excused or unexcused) will affect your progress to move forward in the program or receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

5. Youth Day – Đai Hôi Giới Trẻ

Youth Day is held annually on the Thursday of the Religious Education Congress weekend. All High School students, from all walks of life, are invited to come together to participate in morning and afternoon workshops, culminating in a Youth Rally. Confirmation Candidates must attend at least one Youth Day in either year of the two-year program. This event will have a separate release form and fee.

6. Catholic Youth Fellowship/CYF Night – Hop Mặt Giới Trẻ Công Giáo

The CYF program is designed to create a place where teens get support, grow in faith and friendship while learning to apply their Catholic values and beliefs into their daily lives. A typical CYF meeting has prayers, games and activities that reinforce the Gospel message. These meetings give the candidates a chance to build lasting friendships with peers that have similar values. *CYF meetings are held every other Sunday from 7:30pm-9:30pm*. Check our website <u>holyspiritcyf.com</u> for special events, meeting times, service opportunities, and fundraising opportunities for Youth Ministry.

Confirmation candidates are required to attend at least 2 CYF NIGHTS each year. See calendar

7. Stewardship, Service and Outreach – Quản Lý & Phục Vụ

Stewardship is an important part of any persons' commitment and obligation to a group or organization. Stewardship is composed of three areas: *Time* (service), *Treasure* (financial responsibilities), and *Talent* (using your abilities to make the group better). In order to better understand what WE are responsible for in our Church and community, every Confirmation Candidate will have to show that they are fulfilling their share of the responsibility.

This year we are requiring that all Confirmation Candidates serve in the following ways:

- a. In a Liturgical Ministry (lector, band, usher, hospitality, Mass clean up, or altar server for Youth Mass).
- b. Support a parish ministry with the gift of your time and talents
- c. Perform service projects during the year. <u>See</u> <u>required hours, suggestions, guidelines &</u> <u>calendar on pages 12-13.</u>

In addition, parents and sponsors are expected to work with their teen to complete a personal Service Project. Please view some of the events that our Youth Ministry offers from <u>www.holyspiritcyf.com</u>

8. Sponsors – Người Đỡ Đầu

Sponsors are people who you can rely on during your faith journey. They should be people with a deep commitment to the Catholic faith and who are active, confirmed members of their parish. They should be willing to listen to you, help you answer questions, and be willing to share their faith. Chương trình Giới Trẻ CYF được soạn thảo để giúp con em quí vị được lớn lên trong đức tin cùng với bạn bè khi được học hỏi và áp dụng chân lý Kitô Giáo. Một buổi họp điển hình CYF bao gồm phần dẫn nhập, cầu nguyện, trò chơi và các hoạt động nhằm củng cố sứ điệp Tin Mừng, và được kết thúc bằng giờ cầu nguyện. Những buổi họp này tạo cho con em quí vị một cơ hội để xây dựng tình bạn lâu dài với các bạn có chung một lý tưởng. Buổi họp CYF được tổ chức vào mỗi cách Chúa Nhật từ 7:30pm-9:30pm. Xin quí vị xem mạng lưới holyspiritcyf.com để cập nhật lịch trình những sinh hoạt đặc biệt.

Các ứng viên Thêm Sức phải tham dự ít nhất 2 buổi họp mặt CYF trong mỗi năm.

Quản Lý là một phần quan trọng trong cam kết của bất kỳ ai, hoặc nghĩa vụ cho một nhóm hay một tổ chức. Quản Lý bao gồm bao gồm ba lãnh vực: Thời gian, Tài chính, Tài năng. Để hiểu rõ hơn trách nhiệm trong Giáo Hội và giáo xứ, mỗi ứng viên Thêm Sức sẽ phải xác nhận mình đang thực hiện việc chia sẻ trách nhiệm.

Năm nay chúng tôi khuyến khích các ứng viên Thêm Sức phục vụ những việc sau:

- a. Ban Phụng Vụ (thừa tác viên Lời Chúa, ca đoàn, ban tiếp đón, dọn dẹp sau Thánh Lễ, giúp lễ....) vào các Thánh Lễ Giới Trẻ.

Ngoài ra, chúng tôi xin quí phụ huynh, người đỡ đầu cùng thực hiện việc tông đồ chung với các em. Mục vụ Giới Trẻ cũng sẽ cộng tác tổ chức những dịp phục vụ khác nhau. Chương trình và chi tiết, xin xem www.holyspiritcyf.com

Người đỡ đầu/bảo trợ Thêm Sức là người các em có thể đồng hành và giúp đỡ hành trình đức tin của các em. Người đỡ đầu nên là người thực hành đức tin Công giáo một cách sâu sắc, đã được lãnh Bí Tích Thêm Sức, là thành viên của một giáo xứ. Họ là người sẵn sàng lắng nghe các em, giúp trả lời câu Sponsors are expected to maintain REGULAR contact with their candidate to not only pray, but to socialize and develop a stronger relationship. Sponsors are encouraged NOT to be family members.

- Year I candidates: should pray & discern on their choice of sponsor and submit by Feb. 1. <u>See the guidelines for Sponsor on page 11.</u>
- Year II candidates: should already have a sponsor.

Confirmation Sponsors will be required to attend the large group workshops with their candidate. Please take the time to do more than the required events with your candidate. 9. Saint Project/ Confirmation Name- Hanh Thánh Nhân / Tên Thánh Thêm Sức

As Catholic Christians we are called to be saints, to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect and to have a deep, intimate union with Christ. Candidates will choose a name to be confirmed under. The name should be a Saint's name or the name of a person from Scriptures who modeled what it truly means to pursue holiness. <u>See the guidelines for the</u> <u>Saint Project on page 10.</u>

• Year I candiates: Saint's Reports will be turned in and presented by February 1, 2017.

10. Bishops Letter – Thư Thỉnh Nguyện Lên Đức Giám Mục

By the end of Janurary, all Confirmation Year II candidates are required to write the Confirming Bishop a letter asking for permission to be confirmed. *See the guidelines on page 15.*

Bishop Letters will be collected when the candidate meets with the Priests, Youth Minister or Catechetical Leaders for their final interviews.

11. Confirmation Interview – Phong Vấn

The Priests, Catechetical Leaders, Youth Minister, and Catechists will conduct interview at each year of Confirmation preparation to ensure that the candidate is truly prepared and committed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Confirmation candidates are to sign up for the interview schedule as follow:

- Year I: The 2 weekends of February 12 or 19, 2017
- Year II: Janurary 25 or Feb. 5. *Both Service Projects and the Bishop letter must be turned in.*

As we go through our sacramental preparation for Confirmation, Confirmation saints are chosen to be a person we want to be like, as well as someone who can pray for us from heaven. When you are confirmed, the Bishop will ask what name you have chosen. It must be a **canonized** saint's name, either the one you already have from your baptism, or a saint that you admire. Now is the time to get to know more about this saint. The challenges, holiness, and charitable works of these holy people are examples of what it means to be a faithful disciple, grateful steward and active evangelist.

Examples of correct names:

Francis of Assisi or Francis de Sales Therese of Lisieux or Teresa of Avila Mary, Mother of God Incorrect Names:

Francis Therese Mary

You are required to complete two parts:

Part I: <u>MY CONFIRMATION SAINT (2 pages typed, double space, font 12 (max.), 1" margins)</u>.

Content of paper:

- 1. The saint's picture
- 2. Date and place of birth and death. Some significant facts about the saint's life.
- 3. Describe the challenges, holiness and charitable works of your Saint that are a source of inspiration.
- 4. **Include specific ways** you would like your saint to help you to prepare for Confirmation. In what ways will you need your patron saint to help you after Confirmation?
- 5. What have you learned about your patron saint that you personally desire to imitate? What qualities you would like to have as your own? Why? Are there anyways that you are already similar to him/her?

Part II: <u>I AM A SAINT (1-2 pages typed, double space, font 12 (max.)</u>, 1" margins).

Content of paper:

- 1. Your picture (maximum of picture content half page)
- 2. Your name: (Ex. St. Samantha Nguyen of Fountain Valley)
- 3. Title of your sainthood (the virtue of which you are most known for in your daily life).
- 4. Reflect and acknowledge your God given talents and virtues. Give concrete examples of good deeds that you have done.
- 5. What needs to be "straightened out" in your life to respond to God's call "to be perfect as your Father in heaven is perfect?"
- 6. What is one message that you would leave for the next generation?

SPONSOR'S ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES vai trò và trách nhiệm của người đỡ đầu thêm sức

The Sponsor's function is to take care that the person confirmed behaves as a *fuel wilness of Christ* and faithfully fulfills the duties inherent in this sacrament." *Canon 892*



1. The Sponsor Is - Người Bảo Trợ là Người:

- a. A role model in faith and prayer life. A person that will pray with/for the candidate regularly.
- b. A real friend, someone that the candidate can trust and confide in, and someone who can be there when needed.
- c. Someone the candidate looks up to and someone after which he/she would like to model his/her life. A guide, confidant and listener who will assist the parent(s) in witnessing to the integrity of the Catholic Faith.
- d. A person who will invite the candidate into fuller participation in parish life and service, and whose relationship with the candidate will continue after the celebration of Confirmation.
- e. One who is interested in his or her own growth as he or she walks the faith journey with the candidate.

2. Qualifications For Sponsors - Tiêu Chuẩn của Người Đỡ Đầu:

- a. Must be 18 years or older.
- b. Must be a confirmed and PRACTICING Catholic.
- c. If married- marriage blessed in the Catholic Church.
- d. Must not be restrainted by Church Law. Must be sufficiently mature to fulfill their role as a Sponsor.
- e. May either be male or female.
- f. Must be able to attend meetings, rehearsals, Rites and Confirmation Mass.
- g. May <u>NOT</u> be the mother or father of the person to be confirmed.
- h. Must be able to RECEIVE THE EUCHARIST at the CONFIRMATION MASS.

- d. Không bị trở ngại bởi luật Hội Thánh. Phải trưởng thành đủ điều kiện để làm tròn bổn phận người bảo trợ.
- e. Có thể là phái nam hoặc phái nữ.
- f. Là người có thể tham dự những buổi cử hành phụng vụ, những buổi họp trong quá trình chuẩn bị cho con em lãnh nhận Bí Tích Thêm Sức.
- g. Không phải là là Cha hoặc Mẹ của ứng sinh.
- h. Phải là người có thể lãnh nhận Bí Tích Thánh Thể (được Rước Lễ) trong Thánh Lễ Thêm Sức của các em.

SERVICE PROJECT GUIDELINES

Before making a commitment to a service project, think about the variety of ways in which you can use your talents and abilities to help others. In order to gain a better understanding of the need you are addressing, review the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and Catholic Social Teachings and pray about whether your service project lends a hand to those needs. A few guidelines about the service projects:

- 1. The total hours required for Confirmation Candidates are:
 - Year I: 12 hours minimum of 3 Service Projects.
 - Year II: 15 hours minimum of 3-4 Service Projects.
- 2. Service Projects must be done in the three following context: FAMILY, PARISH, COMMUNITY
- 3. To receive credit for the service projects, candidates must
 - a. Spend a minimum of 2 hours on each project.
 - b. Obtain a signature from the person in charge.
 - c. Reflect & write the report *using the form "Service Project Reflection,*" and submit it to the Office of Faith Formation.
- 4. Three Service Project reports are due by the **DECEMBER 1st, MARCH 1st & APRIL 1st.**

PARISH

SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY

- 1. Help with Children Liturgy at 9AM Sunday Mass

- 1. Help at Human Trafficking Awareness booth to inform the general public of the existence and dangers of human trafficking.
- 2. Help prepare and serve a meal at a shelter (SHIP...) or help at a soup kitchen.
- 3. Participate and/or raise money for charitable organizations: His Hands, Thomas Walkathon, Concern America Walk Out of Poverty...
- 4. Participate in clean-up and beautification programs for your neighborhood or the beach.

During these past 1 1/2 years you have expressed your desire to be confirmed in many ways—through your attendance and participation in class and in group gatherings, by your service to others, in the growth in your faith life through prayer, Mass, and the Sacraments. You have therefore shown that you want to belong fully to the Catholic Christian Community of Holy Spirit Parish. The initiation process, begun for you at Baptism by your parents and by the Church, is soon to be completed at your Confirmation.

It is now time for you to officially request Confirmation from the Bishop of the Diocese of Orange who will come to confer the sacrament. It is the custom here to do this through a letter.

Important Directions:

- Your letter must be TYPED and SIGNED on a clean, unfolded, 8 1/2" x 11" piece of white paper.
- Your letter should be at least one page long.
- Please write your letter to *Bishop Kevin W. Vann*
- Remember, this is a letter, so all of the sentences should be complete thoughts and not just a list of answers to the above questions.
- The letter must be handed in at your confirmation interview. You cannot turn them in early and will be reviewed by the minister interviewing you.



LETTER TO BISHOP VANN

The following information should be included in the letter:

Date

Your Excellency, Bishop Kevin W. Vann

- 1. Your name, age, school you attend, and your Parish.
- 2. The reason why you want to be confirmed and what you have been doing to prepare for this Sacrament.
- 3. State your Confirmation Name and why you chose that Saint.
- 4. State how you plan on living out your Christian commitment after confirmation (i.e., going to Mass weekly, serving the Church, What qualities of Jesus you want to live out in your life)
- 5. An explanation of what the Gospel reading chosen for the Confirmation Mass means to you. <u>(The</u> <u>Bishop will inform us the date and the Gospel reading)</u> What is Jesus saying?
- 6. You may add anything else you think important. State the service projects, retreat experiences and workshops you have participated in and what you have gotten out of those experiences. For example, how you feel you have grown during this time of preparation...or how your service to others may have helped you to grow...or how time spent with your Sponsor may have helped you, how the retreats have helped you in your relationship with Jesus, who is the saint you want to emulate in your life.
- 7. Finally, a formal request to be confirmed.

LECTIO DIVINA

First, find a place where you can be still and quiet. Then, choose a passage of scripture to use as a guide for this time. Psalms work well, but any passage is fine for this practice. Once you find your passage, stop. Be still. Be quiet. I like to be totally silent as much as possible during the entire practice. The only words that need to be spoken out loud are the words of the scripture. Breathe. Notice your breathing. As you breathe deeply, ask God to speak to you. Don't rush.

- 1. **LECTIO (reading),** the first level, involves alert reading of the passage, with "a desire to understand its true content: **what does the biblical text say in itself**?
 - i. When you feel ready, read the passage slowly, out loud. As you read listen for a word or phrase that speaks to your soul. Don't force it, just allow it to come.
 - ii. After you have read through the passage, be still. Think about the words. Breathe.
- 2. MEDITATIO (meditation) prompts the question: What is this passage saying to us?
 - i. Read the passage again out loud. Again, listen for a word or phrase that seems to stand out to you. Then be quiet and still.
- 3. ORATIO (prayer) is the specific moment for prayer: What do we say to the Lord in response to his word?
 - i. Read the passage a final time out loud. Then be quiet and let the word or phrase roll around in your head. Meditate on it. Pray it back to God.
 - ii. Ask Him what He is trying to tell you. Don't force it, let it come.
- 4. **CONTEMPLATIO (contemplation),** we take up, as a gift from God, His own way of seeing and judging reality, and ask ourselves: **what conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of us?**
 - i. After you've prayed, just rest. Don't let distractions derail you. It's ok to be distracted. Give those distractions to God.
 - ii. Think about why you are thinking the thoughts in your head and how they might be connected to the passage earlier.
- **5. ACTIO (action)**, we do well also to remember that the process of lectio divina is not concluded until it arrives at **action**, which moves the believer **to make his or her life a gift for others in charity**.

Pray that this practice might help you experience God in a fresh, inspiring way.



EXAMINATION OF CONSCIOUSNESS AT THE END OF THE DAY

- 1. **PRESENCE:** Center myself in God's presence. Ask for the light of the Holy Spirit to see through God's eyes...
- 2. **GRATITUDE:** What have been the gifts during the day that I should be thankful for?
- 3. **REVIEW:** Where God has been working during the day in my life; where am I co-operating with Him today; where I am co-operating with the sinful element within me and not doing what I want to do in the Lord (Rom 7:15-20).
- 4. **REPENT:** Ask for sorrow and forgiveness for the times when I have not been attentive and responsive to His presence and love in my life.
- 5. **GRACE:** Finally, ask for His help and guidance for tomorrow, trusting that He will be with me.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR A GOOD CONFESSION

Ten Commandments

1. <u>IAM THE LORD YOUR GOD.</u> <u>YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GOD BEFORE ME.</u> Did I fail to love God, to make God first in my life, to thank Him, trust Him, love Him as He deserves? Did I fail to pray? Have I doubted or denied my faith? Was I careless in saying my prayers? Do I give God time everyday in prayer? Have I been involved in magic, Ouja boards, Tarot card, and the occult?

2. <u>YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN</u>. Did I curse or swear? Did I use God's name in vain, lightly, carelessly, in blasphemy? Have I used foul language or jokes?

3. **REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH**. Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation? Was I late to Mass or did I leave Mass early without a serious reason? Was I irreverent in church? Did I fast one hour before Communion? Did I receive Communion in a state of motral sin? Have I been to Communion at least once a year? Did I receive Holy Communion in the state of serious sin? Have I been to confession recently? In any of my previous confessions, did I lie to or deliberately conceal something, especially a mortal sin, from the priest? Did I fail to perform the penance? Did I do unnecessary work on Sunday?

4. <u>HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER</u>. Did I honor and obey my parents? Respect my brothers and sisters? Respect others with lawful authority, especially teachers? Have I talked bad? Did I fail to help at home or to spend time with my family?

5. <u>**YOU SHALL NOT KILL**</u>. Did I give in to feeling of anger or jealousy? Did I keep hatred in my heart? Did I fight? Did I give a bad example or cause scandal? Have I abused alcohol or drugs? Have I had or in any way permitted or encouraged aborting? Have I thought about suicide?

6. <u>YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY</u>. Did I consent to impure glance? Passionate kisses? Sinful touches? Was I immodest in dress or behavior? Did I look at pornography, impure books, magazines or video? Am I guilty of masturbation (impurity with self), fornication (premarital sex), adultery (having sex outside marriage) or contraception (by pills, device, etc.)? Do I live chastely according to my state in life (married, single, or ordained)? Do I avoid laziness, gluttony, idleness and the occasions of impurity?

7. <u>YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.</u> Have I stolen what is not mine? What or how much? Did I return it or make up for what I have stolen? Have cheated on tests or homework? Did I waste time at work? Have I written graffiti (this steals nature's beauty)?

8. <u>YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR</u>. Have I lied or gossiped? Talked about another behind his back? Do I always tell the truth? Am I sincere? Did I reveal secrets that should have been kept confidential? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my talk?

9. <u>YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.</u> Have I consented to impure thoughts? Have I encouraged them by stares, curiosity or impure conversation? Did I neglect to control my imagination or desire other people?

10. <u>YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS</u>. Is my heart greedy? Am I jealous of what another has? Am I envious of others because I don't have what they have? Am I moody or gloomy? Do I work, study and keep busy to counter idle thought? Am I critical, negative, or uncharitable in my thoughts of others? Is my heart set in earthly possessions or in the treasures in Heaven?



Seven Precepts of the Church

- 1. To assist at mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation* and to avoid unnecessary work on Sundays.
- 2. To celebrate the Sacraments frequently, confession mortal sins at least once a year and receiving holy communion during the Easter season.
- 3. To study catholic teaching in preparation for Confirmation and to be confirmed.
- 4. To observe the marriage laws of the Church: to give religious training by examples and words to one's children; to use parish schools and religious education programs.
- 5. To contribute to the support of the church.
- 6. To do penance, including abstaining from meat and fasting on the appointed days.
- 7. To join in the Church's Missionary Spirit / Apostolate.

Holy Days of Obligation (for Latin Rite Catholics)

All Sundays

January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary November 1, the solemnity of All Saints

December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception **December 25**, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Seven Capital Sins vs. Seven Virtues

1. COVETOUSNESS VS. GENEROSITY

- To covet is to neglect the less fortunate and be greedy with money or possessions. See also the 10th Commandment.
- To be generous is having the willingness to give and having only an appropriate regard for one's earthly things.
- 2. PRIDE VS. HUMILITY
 - To have pride is to delay forgiving and to have an inappropriate appreciation for one's self worth.
 - To have humility is to have modest behavior and to give respect to oneself and others.
- 3. LUST VS. CHASTITY
 - It is lustful to dress or act immodestly or to watch TV shows, social media, movies, or read magazines that promote immoral sex or violence. See also the 6th and 9th Commandments.
 - It is chaste to embrace moral purity in though and action, and to treat God's gift of sexuality with reverence and respect.
- 4. ENVY VS. BROTHERLY LOVE
 - It is envious to be excessively jealous of other, to ridicule others, or to be prejudiced.
 - It is brotherly love, or kindness, to be unprejudiced, compassionate, and to have charitable concern for others.
- 5. ANGER VS. MEEKNESS
 - It is the sin of anger to become unreasonably angry, to speak unkindly to others, to fight with others, or to purposely angers others. See also the 5th Commandment.
 - It is meekness, or patience, to focus on seeking appropriate resolutions to conflicts, to forgive, and to show mercy.
- 6. SLOTH VS. DILIGENCE
 - To be slothful is to have extreme laziness, especially in matters of faith.
 - It is diligent to have an appropriate attitude toward living and sharing the faith.
- 7. GLUTTONY VS. TEMPERANCE
 - To be gluttonous to is over-indulge, such as by taking or selling recreational drugs, or to get drunk on purpose.
 - To have temperance, or to practice abstinence, is to have behavior centered on selef-control and moderation.



SOME BASIC TRUTHS OF OUR FAITH



- Who is God? God is the Creator of heave and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.
- What does "Creator" mean? A Creator is one who makes from nothing. The only Creator is God.
- What is God like? God is a pure spirit. He is completely perfect- allknowing, all-good, all-powerful and all-loving.
- 4. What is the mystery of the Blessed Trinity? The mystery of the Blessed Trinity is one God is three divine persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- Does God care about us? God cares about us very much. He keeps us in existence, helps us in everything we do, and watches over us with love.
- How do we know about God? We know about God through what He has created and especially through the Catholic Church and the Bible.
- 7. What is the meaning of life? God gave us life so that we will use it to know Him, love Him and serve Him now and be happy with Him forever in heaven.
- 8. How do we learn to know, love and serve God? We learn to know, love and serve God from the teachings and examples of Jesus Christ.
- 9. Who is Jesus Christ? Jesus Christ is God the Son, who became man for us while remaining God.
- 10. Where do we find the teachings and examples of Jesus Christ?We find the teachings and examples of Jesus

Christ in the Bible, especially in the four Gospels.

- 11. What is the Incarnation? The incarnation is the taking of a human nature by God the Son.
- 12. Why did God become man? God became man to save us from our sins, give us His grace, and teach us what we must believe and do to reach haven.
- 13. What is the Redemption? The Redemption is Jesus' death and resurrection, by which He made up for our sins and won for us the help we need for reaching heaven.
- 14. What do we learn form Jesus' choice of death for our sake?

From Jesus' choice of death for our sake we learn how much He loves us and how terrible sin is.

DIVINE REVELATION

15. What is the Bible?

The Bible is the Holy Book in which God speaks to us through the words of men who wrote what He wanted them to write.

- 16. What are the stages of God's Revelation? God manifested himself to our first parents, Adam and Eve. After their fall, God revealed himself to the Ancestors and the Prophets: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, David...
- 17. What is the full and definitive stage of God's Revelation?The full and definitive stage of God's revelation is accomplished in his Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, the mediator and fullness of Revelation.
- 18. What is Apostolic Tradition? Apostolic Tradition is the transmission of the message of Christ. The apostles transmitted all they received from Christ and learned from the Holy Spirit to their successors, the bishops, and through them to all generations.
- 19. In what ways does Apostolic Tradition occur? Apostolic Tradition occurs in two ways: through the living transmission of the word of God (Sacred Tradition) and through the proclamation of salvation in written form (Sacred Scripture).
- 20. What is the relationship between Tradition and Sacred Scripture? Tradition and Sacred Scripture flow out of the same divine well-spring and together make up one sacred deposit of faith from which the Church derives her certainty about revelation.
- 21. To whom is the deposit of faith entrusted? The Apostles entrusted the deposit of faith to the whole of the Church assisted by the Holy Spirit and guided by the Magisterium.
- 22. To whom is given the task of authentically interpreting the deposit of faith? It has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church (Magisterium) alone, that is, to the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome, and to the bishops in communion with him.
- 23. What is the relationship between Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium? Scripture, Tradition, and the Magisterium are so closely united with each other that one of them

cannot stand without the others. Working together, each in its own way, under the action of the one Holy Spirit, they all contribute effectively to the salvation of souls.

- 24. How is Sacred Scripture to be read? Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted with the help of the Holy Spirit and under the guidance of the Magisterium. It must be read: 1) with the content and unity of the whole of Scripture; 2) within the living Tradition of the Church; 3) with inner harmony which exists among the truths of the faith themselves.
- 25. What is the Canon of Scripture? The Canon of Scripture is the complete list of the sacred writings. The Canon consists of 46 books of the Old Testament and 27 of the New.
- 26. What is the importance of the Old Testament for Christians?

All of the books of the Old Testament are divinely inspired and retain a permanent value. They are written, above all, to prepare for the coming of Christ the Savior of the universe.

27. What importance does the New Testament have for Christians?

The New Testament, whose central object is Jesus Christ, conveys to us the ultimate truth of divine Revelation. The Gospels are the principle witness to the life and teaching of Jesus.

- 28. What is the unity that exists between the Old and the New Testaments? God's plan of salvation is one, and the divine inspiration of both Testaments is one. The Old Testament prepares for the New and the New Testament fulfills the Old; the two shed light on each other.
- 29. What role does Sacred Scripture play in the life of the Church?

Sacred Scripture gives support and vigor to the life of the Church. It is a confirmation of the faith, food for the soul and the fount of the spiritual life.

SIN

30. What is sin?

Sin is disobedience to God and His laws.

- 31. What is original sin? Original sin is the lack of grace with which each of us came into the world because of the sin of our first parents.
- 32. What is personal sin? Personal sin is personal disobedience to God's law through a willful thought, desire, word, action or omission.
- 33. What does sin do to a person?

Serious (mortal) sin drives out God's grace. Lesser (venial) sin weakens the person's friendship with God.

GRACE

- 34. What is grace? Grace is a gift that God gives us to bring us closer to Him.
- 35. What is sanctifying grace? Sanctifying grace is a sharing in God's own life that makes us holy (close to Him).
- 36. What is actual grace? Actual grace is light for our mind and strength for our will, which God gives us whenever we need it.
- 37. Why is grace important? Grace is important because we need God's life and help in order to please Him in life and enter His happiness after death.

THE VIRGIN MARY

- 38. Who is Mary? Mary is the Mother of Jesus and therefore the Mother of God.
- 39. Why do we call Mary our Mother? We call Mary our Mother because Jesus Himself made her the spiritual Mother of the Church and of each one of us.
- 40. What is the Immaculate Conception? The Immaculate Conception is Mary's freedom from original sin from the first moment of her existence.
- 41. What is the Assumption? The Assumption is the taking up of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven body and soul by God's power.

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

- 42. What is the Catholic Church? The Catholic Church is God's people, whom He has joined together in the same beliefs, laws and sacraments under the Pope.
- 43. Why did Jesus Christ found the Church? Jesus Christ founded the Church in order to continue His mission on earth-that is, to save mankind.
- 44. Who was Saint Peter? Saint Peter was the apostle whom Jesus chose to be the first Pope.
- 45. Who is Pope? The Pope is Jesus' representative (vicar) on earth.
- 46. Is the Pope the head of the Church?

The Pope is the *visible* head of the Church and Jesus is its *invisible* Head.

- 47. Why did Jesus give us the Pope? Jesus gave us the Pope for the sake of the unity of the Church.
- 48. Who are the bishops? The bishops are the leaders of the Church, united with the Pope and under him.
- 49. What does Jesus do for us through the Church? Through the Church Jesus gives us grace and teaches us what we must believe and do in order to reach heaven.
- 50. What is infallibility? Infallibility is god-given freedom form making mistakes in matters of faith and morals, which belongs under certain conditions to the Pope and the bishops united with him.
- 51. Why is infallibility important? Infallibility is important because it guarantees to the Catholic Church the sureness of God's truth.
- 52. Why is it important to live a real Catholic life? It is important to live a real Catholic life because the Catholic Church has the sureness of Christ's truth and the fullness of His grace.

THE SACRAMENTS

- 53. How does the life of grace come to us? The life of grace comes to us chiefly through the Mass and the other sacraments.
- 54. What is the Mass? The Mass is the sacrifice of the cross taking place today; a memorial of Jesus' death and resurrection; a holy meal in which we receive Christ Himself.
- 55. What are the sacraments? The sacraments are seven special actions of Jesus through which He gives us His Spirit to make us holy by grace.
- 56. What are the names of the seven sacraments? The seven sacraments are: Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony.
- 57. What is Baptism? Baptism is the sacrament in which Jesus sends us His Spirit to free us from sin, seal us as Christians, and give us His grace.
- 58. What did the grace of Baptism do for us? The grace of Baptism made us God's children, heirs of heaven living members of the Church and temples of the Blessed Trinity, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 59. What is Confirmation? Confirmation is the sacrament in which the Holy Spirit joins us more closely to Jesus and His

Church, strengthens our faith, and seals us as Christ's witnesses.

60. What is the Eucharist?

The Eucharist is the sacrament of Jesus' real and complete presence, in which He renews His sacrifice, comes to us as Holy Communion, and remains close to us in our churches.

61. What is Penance?

Penance is the sacrament in which Jesus forgives our sins, strengthens or news our friendship with Himself and His people, and gives us the strength to do better.

- 62. How do we receive the sacrament of Penance? To receive the sacrament of Penance we: remember our sins are sorry for them; intend not to commit them again; tell them in confession; say or do our penance.
- 63. What are mortal and venial sins? Mortal sins are serious disobediences to god and His law, which must be told in confession. Venial sins are less serious disobediences.
- 64. When is a sin mortal? A sin is mortal when the person knew before or while committing it that it was seriously wrong, yet freely and deliberately decided to do it.
- 65. What is the Anointing of the Sick? The Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament in which Jesus brings healing of soul and often of body to sick or injured people in danger of death.
- 66. What is Holy Orders? Holy Orders is the sacrament through which Jesus gives His Spirit to men to seal them as deacons, priests and bishops and to give them to powers that belong to each position.
- 67. What is Matrimony? Matrimony is the sacrament through which Jesus blesses a marriage and gives the couple the grace to love one another faithfully throughout life, to love their children and to raise their children as good Christians.
- 68. Why are the sacraments important? The sacraments are important because they are the chief ways in which we receive or grow in God's grace and are strengthened to live as we should.

THE COMMANDMENTS OF GOD

- 69. What are God's Ten Commandments? God's Ten Commandments are laws which guide us in living the ways all human beings should live.
- 70. What does God tell us in the first commandment? In the first commandment God tells us that we should pray to Him, believe His teachings, trust Him and love Him.

- 71. What are some of the sins forbidden by the first commandment?
 Some of the sins forbidden by the first commandment are: giving up the Catholic religion; refusing to believe one or more of the Church's teachings; reading books or pamphlets against the Catholic faith; practicing superstition.
- 72. What does God tell us in the second commandment?In the second commandment God tells us to speak with respect of Him, of holy things, of holy places and of persons close to Him.
- 73. What are some of the sins forbidden by the second commandment?Some of the sins forbidden by the second commandment are: using the names of God or Jesus in a wrong way; insulting God or religion; perjury (lying when under oath).
- 74. What does God tell us in the third commandment?In the third commandment God tells us to make Sunday special by worshiping Him at Mass (which may also be done on Saturday evening) and by taking the rest we need.
- 75. What are some of the sins forbidden by the third commandment?
 Some of the sins forbidden by the third commandment are: missing Mass on Sunday (Saturday evening); being late for Mass on purpose; doing unnecessary hard work on Sunday.
- 76. What does God tell us in the fourth commandment? In the fourth commandment God tells us to love, respect, obey and help our parents and to respect and obey others who are in charge of us, such as teachers, the leaders of our Church and country, etc.
- 77. What are some of the sins forbidden by the fourth commandment?Some of the sins forbidden by the fourth commandment are: disobeying one's parents; hating, striking or insulting them; speaking or acting unkindly toward them; causing them anger or sorrow.
- 78. What does God tell us in the fifth commandment? In the fifth commandment God tells us to look after the life, health, safety and spiritual good of ourselves and others.
- 79. What are some of the sins forbidden by the fifth commandment?Some of the sins forbidden by the fifth commandment are: murder; abortion; suicide; euthanasia (mercy killing); drunkenness; drug

taking; unnecessary risk of life; anger, hatred; fighting; leading others to sin.

80. What does God tell us in the sixth and ninth commandments? In the sixth and ninth commandments God tells us to

respect His gift of sex by avoiding the thoughts, desires and actions that are permitted only to married people, and by avoiding conversations, ways of dressing, pictures, books, etc., which could lead us or others to sin.

- 81. What are some of the sins forbidden by the sixth and ninth commandments? Some of the sins forbidden by the sixth and ninth commandments are: adultery¹, fornication², contraception³, homosexual activity, masturbation, deliberate thoughts, words or actions that arouse sexual feelings.
- 82. How can we help ourselves to keep the sixth and ninth commandments?We can help ourselves to keep the sixth and ninth commandments by praying often especially to the Virgin Mary, by receiving Penance and the Eucharist often; by keeping ourselves busy; and by avoiding persons, places or things that might tempt us to sin.
- 83. What does God tell us in the seventh and tenth commandment? In the seventh and tenth commandments God tells us to take care of our own things, to respect what belongs to others and to make up for any stealing or harming of property that we have done deliberately.
- 84. What are some of the sins forbidden by the seventh and tenth commandments?Some of the sins forbidden by the seventh and tenth commandments are: stealing; wanting to steal; unjustly keeping what is not ours; cheating; willfully damaging the property of others; wasting time or materials when working; not paying what we owe.
- 85. What does God tell us in the eighth commandment?In the eighth commandment God tells us to say only what is true and good, and if we have injured someone's reputation to make up for the harm we have done.
- 86. What are some of the sins forbidden by the eighth commandment?Some of the sins forbidden by the eighth commandment are: lying; insulting; harming some one's reputation; criticizing unfairly; not keeping secrets that we should keep.
