

"CAPTAIN CORELLI'S MANDOLIN": 'When Captain Corelli and his Italian army company arrive on the unspoiled island of Cephallonia, young Pelagia and the other villagers meet these uninvited guests with resentment. But as the Italians' charm and passion for life win their acceptance, Pelagia and Corelli begin to develop a bond that transcends the division of nationality and circumstance. Then as the harsh reality of World War II crashes upon the idyllic shores of Cephallonia, Captain Corelli must face the possibility of leaving the island and losing the woman he has come to love' with powerful performances by Nicholas Cage and Penelope Cruz, arid also featuring Christian Bale and John Hurt.

"FORREST GUMP": 'Slow-witted Forrest Gump (Tom Hanks) has never thought of himself as disadvantaged, and thanks to his supportive mother (Sally Field), he leads anything but a restricted life. Whether dominating on the gridiron as a college football star, fighting in Vietnam or captaining a shrimp boat, Forrest inspires people with his childlike optimism. But one person Forrest cares about most may be the most difficult to save - his childhood love, the sweet but troubled Jenny (Robin Wright)'.
