Do you approve our Church government and polity?
I do so approve.

Will you support and maintain them?

I will so recommend.

Are you determined to employ all your time in the work of God?
This is my intention.

gratitude and sadness mingle;

expectancy and hesitancy mix.

God's passion in us for the work we do

is not a faucet we can turn on and off.

Yet, the time has come.

these unfinished manuscripts,

we entrust to God and to you, our colleagues.

You are men and women called by God.

VESTING

(responsive)

Moses was called by God to go into Egypt to free God's people. His call was unexpected and he was skeptical of the new direction God would have him go. Moses asked, "Who am I that I should go to the Pharaoh?"

He was chosen; he was called; he was a child of God.

May you hear the call of God now, for you too have been set apart to serve in deserts and cities, wilderness and empires.

God is changing the course of your journeys even now.

Moses was unprepared to meet God. He did not bow and he did not pray, but God instructed him to "come close". When Moses approached the heat of the burning bush, God instructed him to listen to the hurting people and to serve those who needed to be freed.
