DEVOTION FOR THE WEEK

Why Must We Gather?

If you're reading this from the Sanctuary, welcome back! If you're reading this from home, I hope to see you soon again! Although we may have started resuming physical services later than some churches, it's better late than never that we have done so. Some of you may be wondering, what took WAC so long? As Ps Kelvin had already mentioned before, when it comes to Safe Management Measures, our ethos is to be at least on par with the government's precautions. This means we may choose to be on the safer side.

Another practical manner is not wanting to be too quick in our decisions, only to backpedal on them a few weeks later due to our misjudgment and ending up confusing us. Some of you may be quick enough to spot the irony in how we're resuming services when the case numbers are now higher than when we chose to stop services. You're not wrong! However, with vaccination rates improving, most of those who contract the virus are asymptomatic or only display mild symptoms that do not require immediate medical attention. We also have plans to hold services only for vaccinated members from 7 November, so do go get your shot if you do not want to go through the hassle of having to get swabbed weekly!

Because we have had online services for much longer than most of us have anticipated, we may have forgotten the meaning of gathering as a church. We've become so comfortable watching services from the luxury of our home, not needing to prepare to go out and travel. Unfortunately, some of us may have lapsed into complacency and only tuning in to parts of the service we like.

In case you all didn't know, I do monitor the concurrent viewers count, and can see a graph that YouTube shows how many people tuned in at different times of the service! It's a bit disheartening to see that our view count peaks during the sermon instead of slightly after the start of service. Where's the reverence and respect for the Order of Service and our liturgy which points us to God just as much as the sermon would? I know it is "difficult" at times due to the nature of online services, but we should never stop wanting to give our best to God.

Other than those trying their best to focus during online services, I know there are some of us who now, thanks to experiencing the convenience of technology, have lost the importance of gathering. I don't expect to convince you through one devotion to come back, but I can at least stress and remind us about the importance of gathering. This brings us to the title of today's devotion, why must we gather?

Hebrews 10:23-25

[23] Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. [24] And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, [25] not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (ESV)

Why does the author of Hebrews tell us not to neglect meeting together? I think it boils down to one very important aspect of the Christian life: **fellowship**. Through fellowship, we can spur one another on in our struggles, encourage one another in our battles, and grow together in our faith! I know we can't stay back after service in church to talk like the old days, but nothing's stopping us from forming our groups of 5 and having lunch together elsewhere.

Jesus saw the importance of fellowship. That is why he had his 12 disciples journeying with him throughout his ministry. That is one reason why he was incarnated as a human to be with us, to be in fellowship with us, to fully understand our weaknesses and pains, to tell us that he's with us in life.

Every week when I release the booking link for the coming Sunday's service, I secretly hope for people to complain about the service being fully booked. I encourage us, no need to feel paiseh, don't let "I let others go first" become an excuse not to attend service. If you are unable to come because of a fully booked service, worship reverently from home, and be as fully immersed in the service as you can.

Here's some question we may ask ourselves to keep ourselves in check. What's the state of our hearts? Have we grown cold and neglected the "fellowship" aspect of our walk with God? It'll take some time for us to get used to attending physical services regularly, but just like any other adjustments that we make in life, with the help of God, we'll get there.

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Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer. Forgive us if we have taken you for granted at times. Help us to overcome our weakness in the flesh, and empower us to strive towards wanting to do our best for you. If our hearts have hardened, we implore you to soften it and be surrendered to you. Strengthen our faith, strengthen our will to worship you, and be with us. Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, amen.

RESUMPTION OF PHYSICAL SERVICES

WAC's plans* for reopening were announced on 15 August 2021.

Here is our road map for reopening:

5 September - Service capacity of 50 unvaccinated or vaccinated individuals

7 November onwards - Service capacity of 80 fully vaccinated** individuals

Our services will continue to be broadcasted on YouTube Live.

* Subject to changes in Safe Management Measures

** An individual is considered vaccinated if he/ she has been: a) fully vaccinated, i.e. has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnatry, Moderna or WHO EUL vaccines, with an additional two weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective, b) recovered from COVID-19, or c) has obtained a negative result on a pre-event test taken in the past 24 hours before the expected end of the event.
