








Statue of **Julius Caesar** Rome

What did the Romans do for the People of First Century in Palestine – the Holy Land?



SO... Impact of Rome on Palestine?

Negative Impact:

- 1. Imposing a 'non- Jewish puppet king', Herod the Great ambitious & brutal.
- 2. Introduction of military governors such as *Pontius Pilate*, to oversee the political activities of the state.
- 3. Provoking in-fighting and bitter power struggle between various Zealots and aristocratic leaders so weakening their ability to fend off the Romans as they advanced into Judea.
- 4. Paying taxes to Rome for the upkeep of the Roman army based in Palestine.
- 5. The influence of more and more of the pagan Roman culture.
- 6. The siege and burning of Jerusalem, destruction of the Temple AD 70.

SO... Impact of Rome on Palestine?


Positive impact:

- 1. Building programmes for towns and cities: public building erected, water systems installed and roads laid.
- 2. The third rebuilding of the Temple by Herod the Great in 20BC.
- 3. Legal protection by Rome to the Jews. They were, initially, allowed to continue their religious teaching and practices.
- 4. Stability throughout the Roman Empire.
- 5. Trade, travel, spreading of ideas including the Christian message; Palestine was a Roman province with excellent links to Europe, Africa and Asia. Remember Paul's 3 missionary journeys!
- 6. Rome was a main source of both the trade and wealth.

Paul's Second Missionary Journey

Paul's missionary journeys illustrate the ability of people to move safely from the Holy land to other parts of the Roman Empire.

This, no doubt, significantly helped the spreading of the Gospel.

Second Missionary Journey, 49 A.D.- 52 A.D.



Paul and Barnabus separate into two teams after a sharp disagreement.



Paul and Silas go to Syria then to cities throughout Asia Minor (western Turkey) to strengthen and encourage the churches.



In a vision Paul receives a call from a man in Macedonia to help them. Paul and Silas go to Philippi, its major city.




Paul preaches to Lydia, (a businesswoman) and her whole household is saved. Paul casts a demon out of a slave girl and is locked up and chained in a dungeon.

An earthquake frees all the prisoners. The Jailor and his family are converted.



Paul goes to Thessalonica and Berea. An angry Jewish mob follow him.



Paul leaves
Thessalonica and goes
to Athens, leaving Silas
and Timothy.



At Athens, Paul reasons with Jews, Greeks and Philosophers.
