


When the Saints Go Marching In




Cotton Mill Girls

Standard time - Each chord = 4 beats / 1 measure, except * = 2 beats - Thumb-strum pattern






Make Me Down a Pallet On Your Floor



Ada R. Habershon / Charles H. Gabriel (1907) - with verse lyrics by A.P. Carter (1935)





Standard time - Each chord = 4 beats / 1 bar - Thumb-strum pattern or dbl finger standard pick




Mingulay Boat Song



Wade in the Water


Traditional - First published by Fisk Jubilee Singers (1901)



Standard time - Each chord = 4 beats, except * = 2 beats - Slow swing strum

Freight Train


Elizabeth Cotten (written btw 1906-1912)

Made popular by Peggy Seeger, who had hired Cotten as a nanny Standard time - Each chord = 4 beats / 1 measure - Thumb-strum pattern
