## Difficulty Rating: Beginner

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42 " wide.

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, fussy cut:

two $9^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
two 19-1/2" $\times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## From Fabric B, cut:

eight 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
four 2" x 19-1/2" top/bottom block borders
twelve 2" x 13-1/2" side block borders
eight 2" $\times 9$ " top/bottom block borders

## From Fabric C, cut:

one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: twelve 1-1/2" squares

From Fabric D, cut:
eight 4-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to make:
two 4-1/2" $\times 66-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom outer borders
two 4-1/2" $\times 86-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom outer borders
four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 3 " squares for the HSTs

From Fabric E , cut:
four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: forty-eight 3 " squares for the HSTs

From Fabric F, cut:
one 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two 5-1/2" $\times$ 9-1/2" rectangles
four 3 " x WOF strips. Subcut: forty-eight 3 " squares for the HSTs
seventeen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
four 2-1/2" $\times 38-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
four 2-1/2" x 35-1/2" strips
six 2-1/2" 13-1/2" rectangles
fourteen 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" block sashing strips
forty-eight 2-1/2" squares
six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 1-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## From Fabric G, cut:

fifteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to make: seven $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ row sashing strips two 2-1/2" $\times 78-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side sashing strips

## From Fabric H , cut:

three 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Trim the selvages sparingly to maximize yardage. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to make: two 6-1/2" x 62-1/2" strips

## Assemble the Panel Blocks



Step 1: Sew a 2" $\times 9^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle to the top and bottom of a 9 " $\times 10-$ $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A block. Press. Sew a 2" x $13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle to the left and right edges of the block. Press. The final block should measure $13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ 12".

Repeat to make four Panel Blocks this size.


Step 2: Sew a $2^{\prime \prime} \times 19-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle to the top and bottom of a $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 19-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A block. Press. Sew a 2 " x $13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle to the left and right edges of the block. Press. The final block should measure 13-1/2" $\times 22-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

Repeat to make two Panel Blocks this size.

## Assemble the Pieced Blocks

Step 3: Pair a 3" Fabric D square with a 3" Fabric F square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make forty-eight D/F HSTs.


Step 4: Repeat Step 1 to make:

forty-eight E/F HSTs
Step 5: Gather:
one 2-1/2" Fabric F square
one D/F HST
one E/F HST
one D/E HST
Sew together to form a four-patch, noting the fabric placement and block orientation in the diagram. Press the seams in opposite directions, then sew the rows together, nesting the seams. The resulting unit should measure $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.

Repeat to make forty-eight units like this.

forty-eight D/E HSTs

Step 6: Gather:
four complete Step 5 units
one 1-1/2" Fabric C square
four $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F rectangles
Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 7: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the fabric F strips.


Step 8: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting Block should measure 9-1/2" square. Repeat Steps 6-8 to make twelve Blocks.

## Assemble the Rows



Step 9: Gather:
two small Panel Blocks
three Pieced Blocks
four 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" Fabric F block sashing strips
two 2-1/2" $\times 35-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strips
two 2-1/2" x 13-1/2" Fabric F strips
Arrange the units as shown in the Row Assembly Diagram. Sew together, pressing the seams toward the Fabric F strips.

This is Row 2. Repeat Step 9 to make Row 5.


Step 10: Gather:
one large Panel Block
three Pieced Blocks
three $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F block sashing strips
one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F rectangle
two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 38-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strips
one 2-1/2" $\times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strips
Arrange the units as shown in the Row Assembly Diagram. Sew together, pressing the seams toward the Fabric F strips.

This is Row 3. Repeat Step 10 to make Row 4, noting the difference in where the Panel Block is placed.


## Assemble the Quilt



Step 11: Arrange Rows 1-6 together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, taking care to ensure the blocks and rows are facing the correction direction. Sew each row together, using row sashing strips between each row and at the top and bottom edges of the quilt center. Press seams toward the sashing.

Step 12: Sew the side sashing strips to the side of the quilt center. Press.
Step 13: Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

## Alternate Cutting Directions for Winter Colorstory

Fabrics A-C, E, F, H and Binding, cut as listed on page 4.

## From Fabric D, cut:

four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 3" squares for the HSTs
fifteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to make: seven 2-1/2" x 62-1/2" row sashing strips
two 2-1/2" x 78-1/2" side sashing strips

## From Fabric G, cut:

eight 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to make:
two 4-1/2" x 66-1/2" top/bottom outer borders
two 4-1/2" $\times 86-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom outer borders

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
