A Note from the Principal-Mr. O'Connell

October certainly has been a very busy month at Florence Rideout and Lyndeborough Central Schools. I cannot believe we are already into the month of November. There is a chill in the air and before you know it, the snow will be falling. I am very proud of our students who have already shown tremendous growth this fall.

Thank you for participating in our parent conferences. It was great to see so many families involved in their child's education and academic growth. Should you have further concerns regarding your child's progress, please remember that teachers and staff are available throughout the school year and welcome any questions that you may have.

Your child may have shared with you that emergency drills were practiced at school recently. We practice a variety of emergency drills throughout the school year so that we are familiar with procedures in the unlikely event of an emergency. These drills include school evacuation, shelter-in place, and lockdown. We often conduct these drills in coordination with local Wilton and Lyndeborough Police and Fire Departments. In the event of a local emergency, please help us by remaining calm. Do not call the school, police, or fire department. The school district will utilize an automated telephone notification system to inform you about the situation. Please make every effort to provide the school with current telephone numbers and student medical information.

Anticipation continues to mount as the first phase of construction draws closer to completion. We are still planning to occupy the new classrooms in the phase one addition after February winter recess. Several classes and programs will be moving into new and/or different rooms to accommodate the second phase of construction. We are working very closely with Hutter Construction so that they adhere to the construction schedule and complete the project by the beginning of school next year.

Finally, a few reminders regarding dismissal procedures and policies. Parents/guardians need to always provide the school with a note (signed and dated) when regular dismissal plans are altered. This is for safety purposes and is in the best interest of your child. We will not change dismissal plans with a phone call or e-mail. We will, however; accept a scanned signed note attached to an email.

On behalf of the Florence Rideout and Lyndeborough Central staff, thank you for the countless ways you support our school community whether it is reading to your child every night, practicing math facts daily, or supporting our PTA and PTO. Have a wonderful, restful Thanksgiving weekend and thank you for reading this November issue of the Co-Op Connection.

Typing Practice—All students in grades 2-5 have been set up with typingweb.com accounts to practice their typing. These accounts can be accessed from any computer with internet access. Rainy days are a great time to encourage your child to practice their typing skills. As we begin to take standardized tests on the computer, it will be important for students to type efficiently. The lessons in typing web should be done in order (regardless of skill and grade level), and the program will award trophies for completing each lesson. If the

students are logged in, all work is saved and they will also receive rewards for completion in computer class. 1st graders will begin working on their typing skills in January. If you want to help your child log in to their account, go to typingweb.com.
