


Guild Challenge Winner



Liberty Star Block

We will make a 10" finished pieced block which is from p, 38 of Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting, May/June 2015 that was made by Diane Nagle.



READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FORST.

Fabrics: Cream print: five 3" squares and one $6\frac{3}{4}$ " square

Red floral print: two $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 3" rectangles and two $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Blue floral print: four $3\frac{2}{4}$ " squares

Preparation: On the four blue squares, draw a diagonal on the wrong side.

Sewing: ½" seam allowance

Place a blue square on the 6½" cream square in one corner with the right sides together and lining up the diagonals. Put a second blue square in the opposite corner,

again lining up the diagonals.

These should overlap in the middle.


Stitch &" on each side of the diagonal line cut on and press to the blue squares.

Place another blue square, right sides together, on the opposite corner (see picture). Sew on each side of the diagonal-

on the blue square and cut on the diagonal. Press to the small triangles Square up to 3" x 5½"


The center point should be on 24" on your ruler. You should now have four flying geese units, 3" × 5±"

Sew a 1 4" x 3" red rectangle to each side of a 3" cream square, Press to the red. Sew a 12" x 5½" rectangle to opposite sides of the previous unit. Press to the red.



LAY OUT
Join in rows and press the direction of the arrows. Sew the three rows together and press in the direction on the right side arrows.

Square up to 10½" and sign your name in the seam allowance.



RENEWAL FORM
