This pandemic has been anything but ordinary, but just like the opening of our new plaza this Spring, Mission College is starting fresh with a gradual return to campus. One thing that has not changed is our mission to educate anyone that comes to us.

We value our diversity. We have students from 33 countries. We have students from all walks of life. Education is about learning from others, and we do that every day at Mission College.

We also realize the challenges of paying rent, holding down a job, taking care of family, finding a quiet place to study or relax, or navigating college for the first time, or the fourth time.

We have made it a priority to address some of those needs.

- We have partnered with 2nd Harvest Food bank for a weekly drive-through food pantry.
- We have set up a laptop and hotspot loan program.
- We have created an emergency assistance fund.
- We have given out meal cards and lunches.
- We have opened up our computer lab, which has access to a computer, Wi-Fi and is quiet.

Mission College has already distributed more than \$2.9 million in direct dollars to students since March. This is in addition to providing over 1000 laptops and Wi-Fi hot spots through our loan program, and distributing more than 8,000 meals through gift cards and bagged lunches.

The Puente Project is a national award-winning program that has improved the collegegoing rate of tens of thousands of California's educationally underrepresented students. Puente students take English 1AX and Counseling 5 in the fall semester. They then take English 1B and Counseling 7 in the spring semester. During both semesters, Puente students take part in required events, such as trips to university campuses, and receive mentoring from local professionals. Puente students work closely with their Puente counselor to transfer to a four-year school. This is a fall start program and students must enroll before the fall semester begins.



ENROLLING INTO CLASSES

Students can register for classes online via My Mission Portal starting on their assigned registration dates and until the day before the first meeting day of the classes. They can also register in-person at Admissions & Records located in SEC 118, should conditions allow

All classes of the District shall be open for enrollment to any person who has been admitted to West Valley or Mission College. Enrollment may be subject to any priority system that has been established. Enrollment may also be limited to students meeting properly validated prerequisites and co-requisites, or due to other practical considerations, such as exemptions set out in statute or regulation.

Payment of fees is due at time of registration. The drop for non-payment policy is in effect.

REGISTRATION FEES

Payment of fees is due at time of registration.

Be prepared to pay any outstanding balance on your account at the time of registration. Outstanding account balances will block you from being able to register in the future. Make payments online via My Mission Portal or in-person at SEC 118, should conditions allow.

Mission College encourages all students to apply for financial aid for assistance with paying enrollment fees. To apply visit the Mission College financial aid page at financial aid.missioncollege.edu or come to the Financial Aid office for help at SEC 118, should conditions allow.

All students registered in the West Valley-Mission Community College District (WVMCCD) are assigned a WVM district email: yourname@mywvm.wmv.edu. The email address can be used as an email address, to access Canvas and as a single sign-on for services. Students can go to mcportal.missioncollege.edu for details.

DUAL ENROLLMENT-HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS REGISTRATION

High school students seeking to take classes at Mission College are required to submit an online Application for Admission as well as a High School Dual Enrollment Form for each term they wish to enroll. The Dual Enrollment Form is to be submitted before students will be assigned an online registration date and may be submitted via email to: dual.enrollment@missioncollege.edu or in-person at the office of Admissions & Records in SEC 118, should conditions allow. Students are highly encouraged to submit forms at least two weeks before registration opens for high school students to allow for processing.

The high school principal/designee, and parent/guardian of the student must approve any registration into any college course. Students are required to meet all prerequisites for the courses(s) into which they want to enroll. To obtain the High School Dual Enrollment Form and additional information pertaining to Dual Enrollment, please visit hs.missioncollege.edu.

Dually enrolled high school students are responsible for paying the Health Center

Dually enrolled high school students are not allowed to register into Kinesiology and 900 level courses.

DROPPING/WITHDRAWING FROM CLASSES

It is the student's responsibility to drop/withdraw from classes. Do not assume that you will be dropped by the instructor or by any process that drops students for non-payment. If you do not drop classes that you no longer want to be enrolled in by the published deadlines, you, the student, will be responsible for payment of all enrollment fees related to the class (even if the you never attended), and for any grade assigned by the instructor. Classes may be dropped via My Mission Portal.

CLASS WAIT LIST

A class wait list starts when a class reaches its maximum enrollment capacity during the registration period. Students can add their names to a wait listed class before the class begins. During the registration period, if a student drops from a class that has a wait list, the first student on the wait list will be notified via email that a space in the class is available to their personal and WVM email addresses, and via text (standard text fees apply). The notified student will have up to 48 hours from the time the notification is sent to register into the class. Should the notified student not enroll in the course by the end of the 48 hours the student will be removed from the wait list and the next student on the wait list will be notified that a space in the class is available. The notification system will continue to notify students on the wait list until the next notified student enrolls in the class or the class starts, whichever comes first.

ADDING A CLASS WITH ADD CODES

On and after the first day of instruction and through the Add/Drop period of the course, students that want to add into a class must contact the instructor and ask for an "Add Code." Students will use add codes to enroll themselves into a course via My Mission Portal. Students must use assigned add codes before the Add/Drop period deadline (see Calendar for dates). A different add code is required for each class to be added on or after the first meeting of the class. Successfully adding a course online with an add code is a two-step process 1-validation, 2-submitting changes. Students may be able to add a course on or after census date with special permission. Adding classes after the refund deadline will require that new fees be paid for the new course(s) added.

COURSE REPETITION AND FAMILIES OF COURSES

State regulations severely limit the ability of courses to be repeated after receiving a passing grade. There are groupings of courses in the West Valley-Mission Community College District with similar active participatory content called "families" and courses in these defined families are linked, independent of which college where they are taken. Families are identified within the Kinesiology, Wellness & Human Performance, Physical Education, Art, Theatre, and Music disciplines, and students may only attempt up to four courses in any single family. An attempt is defined as receiving any grade or notation (e.g., W for withdrawal) in any previous or current terms – this is a cumulative count of attempts. If a family has less than four courses in its offerings and you have a received grade notation for each of its courses, the maximum attempts have been reached.

Students with documented, extenuating circumstances must complete and submit a Student Petition to the Admissions & Records Office for consideration of beyond four attempts within an individual family.

Refer to the table in the online schedule, college catalog or consult with a Counselor to review the full list of courses within families.

REFUNDS

To be eligible for a refund of enrollment fees students must drop classes by the published deadline.

Dropping a class after the published deadline will result in loss of enrollment fees. Refund requests for ASB cards and parking permits must be made at the Admissions & Records office by the "last day to drop with a refund" deadline. A parking permit refund requires the return of the parking permit.

Refunds for credit card payments will be returned to the credit card used to pay the fees. Check and cash payments will be refunded by check and mailed to the student's current home address on record. It is important that we have a current address on file. Refunds for eligible students are processed after census for full term courses, unless otherwise requested by the student. Refunds for complete withdrawals from short-term courses are processed within 7 to 10 business days.

PREREQUISITES

Some courses have prerequisites. A prerequisite is a class or skill that is required before enrollment into a preferred class is allowed. Prerequisite information for individual classes can be found in the college catalog course listings. For information on how you may be able to clear prerequisites through alternate means visit https://www.missioncollege.edu/student_services/assessment/prerequisites.html

AUDITING OF COURSES

Mission College allows auditing of courses except for courses in programs that require special preparation and/or program admission on a limited basis. The California College Promise Grant will not cover the fee for an audit class.



TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

Grants: Financial aid based on financial need. It does not have to be repaid (unless you withdraw from school and owe a refund).

Scholarships: Money awarded to students based on academic, financial need or other achievements to help pay for educational expenses. Scholarships generally do not have to be repaid.

CC Promise Grant: A form of CA State aid that waives the enrollment fee (\$46/unit) for eligible CA resident students.

Work Study: A federal student aid program that provides part-time employment while enrolled in school to help pay for educational expenses. Consideration for an award requires a completed FAFSA is required.

Federal Student Loans: Money borrowed from the federal government to help pay for educational expenses. A federal student loan is borrowed money you must repay with interest.

- Show financial need.
- Not be in default on an educational loan nor owe a refund to any financial aid office.
- Be registered, or formerly registered, with the Selective Service (for male students only, between the 18-26 year of age).
- Have the ability to benefit from the education offered. This can be met by holding a high school diploma, GED, passing the CHSPE (CA HS Proficiency Exam) or be home-schooled certified.
- Be making satisfactory progress.

PARKING INFORMATION

PARKING REGULATIONS - OVERVIEW

A valid student, staff, or one-day "daily" visitor parking permit is required to park on campus. Student and visitor parking permit requirements are enforced Monday through Sunday, between 7:00 AM and 10:00 PM.

Purchase and/or possession of a permit does not authorize parking on campus. It is the responsibility of the driver to properly park the vehicle and to properly display a valid and authorized permit. Vehicles with car covers are no exception.

Restricted areas, including disabled parking, red zones, loading zones, staff parking, and time zones, are enforced every day, 24-hours a day. Overnight parking is prohibited without prior authorization from the District Police.

PURCHASING A PARKING PERMIT

A semester-length student parking permit may be purchased online at missioncollege.edu or in person at the Admissions and Records Office. For online purchases, a printable temporary permit will also be provided if the permit purchased is currently in use. To purchase a semester-length permit, either online or in person, you will need to know your vehicles make, model, color, and license plate number. If you are a Financial Aid student receiving a California Promise Grant (Formerly Board of Governors Waiver), you can purchase your permit online but you must do so via the link in the student portal located on the college website.

Semester-length parking permit refund requests must be made in accordance with the refund schedule identified by Admissions. For permits purchased in-person at the Admissions Office, please take your permit to the Admissions Office to request a refund. For permits purchased online and mailed to your home, please take your permit to the District Police office.

One-day "Daily" parking permits may be purchased at any of the daily permit dispensers located in parking lots B, C and D. Daily permits are \$3.00 per day and all dispensers will accept cash, coins, and credit cards.

To be valid, all permits must be displayed on the front dashboard and the entire permit, including the expiration date, must be visible from the outside of the vehicle.

WINTER SESSION PARKING INFORMATION

There is no grace-period during the Winter Session. All vehicles parked on campus during the Winter Session must have a valid parking permit properly displayed at all times. During the Winter Session (Tuesday, January 4 through Thursday, January 27, 2022) all of the following parking permits will be valid for use:

- Spring 2022 Semester Permit
- Daily Permit

Students who have already purchased a Fall 2021 or Spring 2022 semester length permit may use either of these permits to legally park on campus during the Winter Session.

SPRING SEMESTER PARKING INFORMATION

A student parking "grace-period" will be observed during the week immediately prior to the start of the spring semester and during the first week of the spring semester. (The "grace-period" begins on Monday, January 24, 2022 and ends on Sunday, February 6, 2022.) During the grace period, no parking citation will be issued to any vehicle that is parked in a marked student parking stall without a permit; all other parking violations will be enforced. Parking citations may be issues to vehicles failing to display a valid student parking permit beginning Monday, February 7, 2022.

GENERAL PARKING INFORMATION

VISITOR PARKING - Visitors who will be on campus for a brief visit may take advantage of a limited number of free forty (40) minute time zone parking stalls located in the front row of Parking Lot A, or in our new visitor lot, located next to the Student Engagement building at front entry circle. Visitors planning a longer visit to campus should purchase a one-day "daily" parking permit at any of the daily permit dispensers located in parking lots B, C and D.

MOTORCYCLES/TWO-WHEELED VEHICLE PARKING --Motorcycles and other two-wheeled vehicles are prohibited from parking in spaces designated for four-wheel vehicles. Designated motorcycle parking is available at the front of each parking lot. No parking permit is required for two-wheeled vehicles.

DISABLED PARKING - All individuals who are disabled (as defined in the California Vehicle Code Section 295.5) and use a designated disabled parking stall must display a valid placard or specialized license plates issued by the DMV. Failure to display a valid placard or plate may result in a citation and fine.

SPECIAL PARKING AND LOADING- Students or Staff members who have special parking or loading needs must make arrangements with Parking Services in advance. Business cards or notes left on the vehicle are not acceptable and a citation may result. No warnings are issued.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING - Electric vehicle charging stations, also known as "E.V." stalls, are located in the front rows of Parking Lots C and D. Students, staff, and visitors are welcome to use the charging stations; however, a valid student, staff, or one-day visitor parking permit must be displayed on the vehicle while it is parked in an "E.V." charging stall.

LOST/STOLEN PERMITS -Stolen permits should be immediately reported to the District Police Department by calling 408-855-5435 or by visiting the Police business office located at the Campus Center. Lost permits will not be replaced free of charge, however, a replacement permit may be purchased at the original purchase price.



PHARMACY TECHNICIAN PROGRAM
