### 2. PDF Tools

- Adobe Acrobat
  - Versions: Adobe Reader, Adobe Acrobat Standard, Adobe Acrobat Pro, Adobe Acrobat Pro Extended
  - Product comparison: www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/matrix.html
  - o (In)compatibility with earlier versions
- Other "Comparable" Products

  - Verify compatibility with Acrobat features

#### 3. Editing and Commenting PDF Files

- Using Commenting Tools in a normal review cycle [don't use only sticky note comments]
  - Available in Reader only if the PDF file author has enabled them using Adobe Acrobat Pro (Advanced > Extend Features in Adobe Reader)




Figure 1. Adobe Acrobat Professional: Tools for commenting and markup.

- Comment & Markup tools (Tools > Comment & Markup / Tools > Customize Toolbars / View > Toolbars > Comment & Markup) [see Figure 1]
  - o Text Edits, Highlight Text, Callout, Arrow, Rectangle, etc.
  - Show/Hide Comments




Figure 2. Adobe Acrobat: Comments list open in Adobe Acrobat.

  - o Show/Hide Comments List [see Figure 2]
  - o Spell checking: Edit > Check Spelling > In Comments...
    - Settings: Edit > Preferences > Spelling
  - Exporting comments as an FDF (Form Data Format) file: Document > Comments > Export Comments to Data File




Figure 3. Adobe Acrobat: Print settings dialog box.

  - Printing Comments: File > Print > Comments and Forms > Document and Markups (or Document and Stamps) [see *Figure 3*]
  - Identity setup: Edit > Preferences > Identity
- Typewriter tool
  - Available in Reader only if the PDF author has enabled it using Adobe Acrobat Pro (Tools > Typewriter > Enable Typewriter Tool in Adobe Reader or Advanced > Extend Features in Adobe Reader)

- Summarizing Comments: Comments > Summarize Comments
- Touching up text (changing text and text properties)
  - Tools > Advanced Editing / Advanced Editing toolbar
  - o TouchUp Text Tool
  - Crop (also Document > Crop Pages)
- Inserting/extracting/rearranging pages
  - Document > Insert/Extract/Replace/Delete Pages, or use the Pages navigation pane on the left
- E-mail-based review or shared review (on acrobat.com) for multi-party reviews

### 4. Searching for Text in PDF Files

- Edit > Find: text within the current document




Figure 4. Adobe Acrobat: Search window with advanced search options.

- Edit > Search: text in one or more files [see Figure 4]
  - Basic Search Options
  - Advanced Search Options
- Indexing (only in Professional): possibility to index hundreds of files for quick searching
  - Select Advanced > Document Processing > Full Text Index with Catalog
    New Index
  - Name the index, select directories to be included, click Build and specify location for the index file
  - Use the resulting .pdx file for searching
- Creating a Searchable Image
  - With the image file open in Acrobat, select Document > OCR Text Recognition > Recognize Text Using OCR
  - o This can also be done with scanned images: Document > Scan to PDF

#### 5. Creating and Filling Electronic Forms

- Simple filling with Typewriter tool
- Using text boxes
- Fillable forms (IRS W-9)
- Converting electronic files to forms using Form Wizard
- Blueberry PDF Form Filler; FREE application for filling in and printing PDF forms (<u>www.bbconsult.co.uk/Resources/PDFFormFiller.aspx</u>)
  - o Note: deselect "Lock All Controls" button

#### **6. Using Electronic Signatures**

- Inserting a scanned signature
  - o copy and paste via clipboard (as a "stamp")
- Creating and using a digital ID
  - Creating a digital ID: Advanced > Security Settings > Digital IDs > Add ID > "A new digital ID I want to create now" > Next > New PKCS#12 digital ID file > Next. Fill the information fields, as needed, click Next. Select location for the ID and define a password. Click Finish to return to the Security Settings dialog box. Click Close.

Signing a PDF document: Advanced > Sign & Certify > Place Signature.
 Drag a rectangle where you want to place the signature. Choose a digital ID, type the password, choose appearance and click Sign.

#### 7. Converting PDF Files to Editable Text

#### Adobe Reader

- Copying and pasting using Clipboard
  - Column select mode (Alt), selecting whole page (4 clicks), selecting all (Ctrl+A; "all" can be either whole page or whole document depending on the Page Display setting: View > Page Display > Single Page vs. all other settings), copying with or without formatting (right click menu; if available)
- Save as Text menu option (File > Save as Text)

#### **Adobe Acrobat**

- File > Export or File > Save As (Word, Excel, html, xml, etc.)
- Right click menu options: Copy, Copy As Table, Save As Table, Open Table in Spreadsheet
- Tables can be tricky to convert with any of the above methods
- Conversion settings: Edit > Preferences > Convert From PDF

  - o Remember document confidentiality when using online tools

# **Using ABBYY PDF Transformer**




Figure 5. ABBYY PDF Transformer: Converting a PDF file to Word format.

- Simple just a few clicks [see *Figure 5*]
- PDF conversion and PDF creation
- Advanced Options for Word files: Original layout, Text flow, Keep pictures
- Advanced Options for Excel files: Ignore text outside tables, Convert numeric values to numbers
- Recommended fonts for Chinese, Japanese, Hebrew and Thai

#### Using ABBYY FineReader





Figure 6. ABBYY FineReader: Converting a PDF file to Word format.

- Full-range OCR program for scanning, PDF/image file conversion and PDF creation [see Figure 6]
- Open an image file (PDF, TIF, etc.) or scan a document
- Read file using the OCR tool
- Image can be edited (Edit Image button)
- Several general and file-specific options for perfecting the output (Tools > Options) [see Figure 7]
- Output can be previewed on the Text Window (right side)

- Check spelling (allows you to verify words that the OCR program misread or did not recognize) and make other editing corrections on the Text Window
- Save as Word, Excel, etc. file

# Post-editing Converted Files in Word/Excel

- Often additional formatting or "cleaning" is needed
- Paste Special in Word/Excel can be useful
- CodeZapper and FormatFixer (Word macros; available from http://tech.groups.yahoo.com/group/dejavu-l/files

# **Translating PDF Files Using CAT Tools**




Figure 8. Trados Studio: PDF filter settings.

- Trados Studio, Wordfast Pro and memoQ offer support for PDF files [see Figure 8]
- Not very practical in most cases. A better solution would be to use a good PDF conversion tool to convert the file to Word format. For more info, see <a href="http://tradoshelp.wordpress.com/2010/05/17/">http://tradoshelp.wordpress.com/2010/05/17/</a>




Figure 9. Adobe Acrobat: Security Settings dialog box

- File > Properties > Security [see Figure 9]
- Unprotecting PDF files

**Figure 7. ABBYY FineReader:** Available layout options when converting PDF files to Word format.




Figure 10. AlignFactoryLight: Available filtering criteria for file alignment.
