#### Making Sense of the Cross

This year Easter Sunday falls in March. Although Easter isn't as big a celebration in the UK as Christmas, Jesus' death on the cross and resurrection is the crux of the Christian faith.

The significance of the cross took me a long time to appreciate. I simply accepted it had happened and that was it. I went to a Church of England primary school where the day began with hymns and prayers and a monthly talk by the Vicar. I moved onto a Roman Catholic secondary school where the day also began with hymns and prayers. I learnt to genuflect, cross myself and feel a bit holy in the school chapel. The cross didn't really come into it.

I thought I was a Christian because in my school atlas the UK, along with all other 'Christian' countries, was pink. Christianity was something you inherited. When I told a dear friend this she laughed and put me right by explaining the point of the cross, a mystery to me at the time. Her words were along these lines: 'Because we sinned in the Garden of Eden we were separated from God and condemned to die. God is perfect and we can't get back to him by our own good deeds, going to church or hoping for the best. We needed someone perfect to do it for us, that's why Jesus died on the cross in our place and coming back to life overcame our death. He forgives our sins and offers us a fresh start when we believe and put our trust in him. This gives us peace with God.'

Well, that made complete sense but because it was 3am we didn't talk any further! I was content. It was as if the final 'peace' of my puzzle had been put in place and with it the beginning of personal enlightenment. I didn't say any special prayer but I've never looked back, why hadn't I 'got it' before? It seems so simple. St Paul wrote, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Corinthians 1:18

If you would like peace with God the following prayer may be helpful: Lord Jesus, thank you for dying on the cross for my sins. I ask your forgiveness for all my failings and come to you for life, power and peace. Amen.

#### From the Rector

Christians Against Poverty - After much prayer and consultation, I will be finishing as Team Rector at the end of May 2016. I have decided to take the opportunity to become a part-time Centre Manager helping to lift people in the Weston-super-Mare area out of debt and poverty. I recognise that this may come as a shock to some and I have written a Pastoral Letter, which explains more. Copies are available in the churches.

In my new role as Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Centre Manager for the Weston-super-Mare area, I will be employed for 16 hours a week, starting in June 2016, subject to completion of DBS clearance. Christians Against Poverty was set up in 1996 and it's aim is to help people caught in the grip of debt and poverty. There are around 290 CAP Debt Centres in the UK and, on average, 2,500 families become debt-free every year, with a number of these coming to Christ. The CAP Debt Centre for Weston-super-Mare and the surrounding area is being set up by local churches. CAP work through a lead church, which is in partnership with other churches. Destiny Church will be taking the role as Lead Partner working with other partner churches, including St Martin's Church. The CAP Debt Centre will provide debt counselling through community-based home visits.

Liz and myself would like to say how much we have appreciated the love and support from Churchwardens, Clergy, Readers, Staff and members of all the four churches throughout our time in the Parish. We would also very much appreciate your prayers as we seek to be obedient to God's call in this new phase in our lives.

**Children in Communion** - Open meetings were held in January for all who were interested in finding out more about this. Many parents and children attended and these were fun and interactive. The children are learning more about what Communion is all about during their Sunday teaching and activities. If anyone wants to discuss these arrangements in more detail, or has any questions, please do speak to a member of the clergy.

Lent Course, Holy Week and Easter - It feels like we're zooming in towards Easter. During Lent, our Parish Lent Course has been looking at the words of Deuteronomy 6:5, "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." Look out for details of all the Holy Week and Easter services across the Parish, which begin with Palm Sunday on 20 March and continue into Holy Week, through to Easter Day on 27 March.
