Edward M. Nelson, III, 68 years old, passed away on April 16, 2017, at Cleveland Clinic after complications resulting from surgery. He was a resident of Charleston, WV. Edward (Ed) was born in Salem, WV, grew up in Parkersburg, WV, and moved to the Charleston area in 1998. He attended Western Reserve Academy in Ohio, WVU Parkersburg, Vanderbilt University, and WVU School of Pharmacy. He was a pharmacist in Ohio and WV and retained his certifications throughout his retirement. Prior to retiring, he was President of Nelson's Drugs, his family business, located in WV and Ohio. Ed had many interests, but spent the majority of his free time participating in activities that involved competitive shooting and supporting the West Virginia State Rifle and Pistol Association, of which he was District 6 Director. He belonged to the NRA, Fort Harman Rifle Club, Lumberport Rifle and Pistol Club, and various FOPA locations. He eagerly looked forward to his yearly trek to Port Clinton, Ohio, along with fellow members of the West Virginia Pistol team to compete in the National Matches of the Civilian Marksmanship Program. In addition, Ed was a long standing member of the Marietta Shrine Club and the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry. Throughout his life, he was a loyal WVU fan and spent many hours watching games, studying the coaches and players, streaming the Mountaineer Sports Network, and visiting the fans' forums. A very important and enjoyable part of Ed's life was the relationship with his friends at Nautilus in Kanawha City, where he was a member for many years.

Some of the happiest times of his life were spent spoiling his grandchildren. He was always willing to let them "break some of the rules." His wisdom and unfailing dedication to his family, made him the person everyone turned to when a problem needed solved. His keen intelligence and unfailing knowledge of so many subjects were a common reference source for everyone around him. His wit and sense of humor could lighten any situation and will be deeply missed.

He was preceded in death by his father, Edward M. Nelson, Jr. and stepmother, Diedre Nelson; and mother, Huldah (Nelson) Rymer, and stepfather, Dr. Ralph Rymer. He is survived by his wife, Linda Runyan Nelson of Charleston; stepson Jason Creech of New York; stepdaughter Shelli (Matthew) Milazzo and grandchildren Leighton, Brooks, and Emerson Milazzo of Florida. Also, surviving are sister Suanne (Tommy) Schweitzer of Ohio; sister Jane (Tom) Weaver and nephew James Weaver of Michigan; sister Deedee (Andy) Hulett, and nieces Maddy, Ava, and nephew Jack Hulett of Illinois; father-in-law James Runyan, sister-in-law Sandy (Charles) Fletcher and nephew Chad Fletcher of Alum Creek.

Brassmasters' Sponsored Junior Shooter Receives College Scholarship

Taylor McClain, Brassmasters' sponsored Junior Shooter has been awarded a \$1,000 Civilian Marksmanship Program College Scholarship for the 2017-18 academic year. Taylor began pistol shooting with Brassmasters four years ago and under the watchful eyes of Allen White and Jim Pennington, she continues to post very good scores in NRA Precision Pistol Matches and at most matches surpasses her previous best score. She attended the 2016 NRA National Pistol Championships at Camp Perry, Ohio and was a firing member of a West Virginia Pistol Team. Taylor was the State Marksman Champion at the 2016 Ed Williams Memorial State Precision Pistol Championships.



Ms. McClain graduated from Lewis County High School in June with a 4.0 GPA and has been accepted at Glenville State College for the fall semester. She plans to major in education and minor in English.

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) offers \$1,000, one-year scholarship assistance to qualified juniors in order to encourage and reward their outstanding efforts. Based on merit, selected individuals are high school seniors who are currently enrolled in a team or club that is participating in rifle or pistol marksmanship competitions. The CMP seeks applications from high school seniors who currently compete in marksmanship competitions.

CMP Scholarships are one-year awards that may be used to fund any accredited secondary education or vocational program. CMP Scholarships may also be used to pursue a post-secondary education during the upcoming school year.

The scholarships are paid to the scholarship recipient but must be countersigned by the financial aid offices of the college where the student is enrolled. The check may then be used to pay other fees or expenses that are not covered by other awards or grants.

To be eligible for CMP scholarships, juniors must:

- Be a U.S. Citizen.
- Be of good moral character.
- Have achieved a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average.
- Be a graduating high school senior.
- Demonstrate acceptance to a university, college or trade school leading to a diploma or trade certification.
- Demonstrate rifle or pistol marksmanship competition experience.

Annual Mountaineer Regional Strawberry Championships May 20th & 21st 2017

2017 WV Smallbore Convention Prone Champion Mitchell Nelson

CAMP PERRY, OHIO

Vernon Reichenbecher of Huntington, WV, was the top Senior competitor in the National Trophy Pistol Match held in the Civilian Marksmanship Program portion of the National Pistol Matches which took place June 30-July 2, at Camp Perry, Ohio. The National Trophy Match is fired most often with the Service Pistol, either the Model 1911 .45 caliber Service pistol or the Beretta M9 9 millimeter Service pistol, although this year, other pistols are approved for the competition. There were three hundred fifteen competitors from all over the United States in attendance. Reichenbecher's score of 272-6X place him twenty seventh over-all, after the All Army Pistol team members, Marine Corps pistol team members and previous National Champions. Other West Virginia State Pistol

Team members placed well also. Mark Bentley from Barboursville was tenth, William Murphy from Looneyville was fourteenth and Al Talbott from Buckhannon was twenty eighth.



Vern also achieved the President's One Hundred placing within the top one hundred competitors in the President's Pistol Match.

The National Pistol matches will resume on July 10, when the National Rifle Association portion of the matches are held at Camp Perry. Those matches will consist of .22 caliber, center-fire and .45 caliber individual matches and team matches in each caliber. West Virginia is expected to field two teams in those matches.






