<p>Maths</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know and understand squared and cubed numbers including their roots. For example $4^3 = 4 \times 4 \times 4 = 64$. Complete your daily Maths LBQ task. Play the fun Maths Games for 7-11 year olds on Top Marks – see link 1. Complete the Year 6 Maths home reading pack on Class Secrets – see link 2. Watch BBC Super Movers videos and take notes/make posters – see link 3. Teach someone in your house how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions. Create a checklist for how to do long division and long multiplication. Create a tally chart recording what snacks are eaten each day in your house. Then, display this information using a chart of your choice: bar chart, pictogram, line graph or pie chart (Watch link 4 to help you). Revise shape, position and movement using link 5. <p>Science</p>	<p>Evolution and Inheritance & Working Scientifically</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch (link 1) from Natural History Museum website explaining how evolution works with bird lice as example. Play the Evolution experience game on link 1. Find and compare photographs of you and your parents at a similar age. Watch the video links in online learning link 2 to compare information on a wide range of animals and to see how animals have evolved over time. Using the Link 3, 4, 5 complete a biography of Anning, Wallace and Darwin. Using Link 6 design a poster or an information booklet to explain adaptation, inheritance and evolution. Can you complete the Evolution and Inheritance quiz on Link 7? You must include the country's population; physical features such as mountains, weather, rivers and lakes; and human features such as buildings and transport links. • Create a map of your local area identifying any physical and human features. Remember to create a key. Use the link to help you! • Write a persuasive letter to your adult persuading them to take you to a country of your choice. Make sure it could actually be made – label your materials. Look at your invention after 2 days. Can you add anything extra to make it better? • Research different boat designs for various purposes (travelling, fishing, exploring etc). Look at the materials that are used for building boats, any pulley systems and sails. Then, design a boat for a specific purpose - think carefully about the materials you would use, the way the boat would travel and how many people would be able to travel in it. • Design a structure that can hold the weight of an orange.
