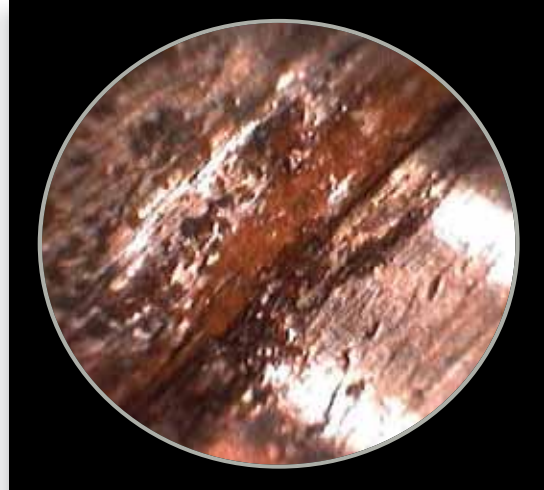

Ready on the Firing Line...

"Ready on the Firing Line..." is a monthly feature of the magazine, where questions on all aspects of precision shooting are answered by Benchrest Hall of Fame members and/or seasoned benchrest shooters.

This Month's question:

- Do you recommend shooters to have their own chamber reamer, and why? Do you have one and its dimensions?

Jack Neary

Lee, If you are chambering more than 1 or 2 barrels a year, then I would recommend purchasing your own reamer. I use a JGS 1045 reamer, as JGS reamers are slightly larger in the body than Henriksen and they are much, much easier to obtain a proper sizing full-length die. The small body dimension of Henriksen reamers are currently causing many BR shooters fits in trying to find a FL dies that small enough to properly size their cases.

Dave Coots

Definitely buy your own reamer. It is one of the cheapest items in Benchrest IMO. Get a sizing die to match and you are good to go. No more sizing problems. I am using a Henriksen standard PPC reamer now with the old fashioned .262 ND. I would switch to a .268 ND but I don't want to go through the hassle to get a straight line die to match a new reamer.

Joel Nader

(2019 2-Gun World Champion)

Lee, Having one's own chamber reamer is nice from the standpoint of familiarity. Every time you set up to shoot a new barrel you will know where to start your evaluation process.

The reamer's chamber length and free bore should be paired with your favorite bullet so that when the bullet is seated to touch the rifling the heel of the bullet should be about 1/3 of the way down the case neck.

I have used different reamers and settled on a 1.510- .040fb to match up

with my 8.5 ogive boat tail (.820-.825 length jacket).

Peter Smith

In a perfect world, every shooter would have his own reamer. It just makes things so much easier when everything is the same barrel to barrel. I am so fortunate that the gunsmith chambering my barrels takes great care so that every barrel I have will use the same brass with the same die and die setting. My reamer is a JGS "Borden Revision" reamer with a .020" throat. This reamer is a tiny bit larger diameter at the base so I never have trouble with any unformed brass fitting the chamber and getting a sizing die to match is not an issue.

Harley Baker

Lee, I would highly recommend that shooters have their own chamber reamer and matching full length die. Two main reason are that you get used to shooting the same reamer set up and can learn the nuances from barrel to barrel and bullet to bullet plus with a matching

full length die you do not overwork your brass. There are other reasons but these two are critical. My reamer specs by JGS

- 1) .272 Neck
- 2) 1.510 Chamber length
- 3) .035 -.040 Free Bore

The Editor

My reamer is from Hugh Henriksen. It's has 0.268 neck with a trim length is 1.50", which is about .010 shorter than most. Also, my lead angle is 1° 50' with a freebore length of .070. This freebore provides an overall length on the loaded round that seems to work well even the heaviest powder charges while still holding the majority of bullets firmly. I don't think it is critical to have your own reamer (I didn't have one 15 years). However, I like the fact that now I can slap a new barrel on any of my rifles, and pretty much know where I'm going to start my tuning loads. It's just one less variable I don't need to be as concerned with. One more point, a good reamer can last a lifetime.

Match Report Received on 7/10/19

George Lozano Wins the 200-yard Visalia Unlimited Championship June 15-16, 2019

Visalia, California was the site of two exciting days of unlimited shooting, with 20+ rail guns and a handful of bag guns ready to shoot small groups.

May was all 100 yards so this month we shot four straight aggregates of 5 shot groups. The weather was warm and by the 3rd or 4th target in the morning the mirage made it difficult to impossible to see the rings on the target and individual bullet holes.

Lester Bruno won the first aggregate with 0.1861, including the small group with a 0.128. He was followed by George Lozano and Gary Sinclair with 0.1899 and 0.2106 aggregates respectively.

In the afternoon, John Pierce won his first of two straight dominating aggregate wins. John was first with 0.1736, followed by George Lozano with a 0.2127 and Lester Bruno with a .2168.

The weather was a little cooler on Sunday morning and we got an earlier start so it was easier to see more targets before the mirage got the best of us. John Pierce was the hot hand once again and posted a fantastic 0.1523 aggregate.

He was followed by Jack Childers with a flat 0.2 and Lou Murdica with a 0.2024 agg.

The last afternoon aggregate was won by Lester Bruno with a 0.2053, with Jack Childers close behind at 0.2080 and Jason Peterson rounding out the top 3 with a 0.2138 aggregate.

When all of the shooting was done, the 200-yard champion was George Lozano with a 200 yard aggregate of 0.2067. George has been busy with work the last few years and hadn't shot in well over a year, but he clearly hadn't lost his ability to watch the wind flags and keep his rail gun in tune. Lester Bruno was second with a 0.2131, Gary Ocock was third with a 0.2208, Jack Childers was fourth 0.2255 and Jason Peterson came in fifth with a 0.2363 aggregate.

When combined with the four 100 yard aggregates from May, Gary Ocock was the top shooter, posting a grand aggregate of 0.1885. Lester was second with a 0.1927 and Jack was third at 0.2237.

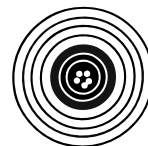

KNOW THE RULES: National Bench Rest Shooters Association Rule Book & By-Laws(See https://www.nbrsa.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/07/rule_book_nbrsa_20190719.pdf)**4.10. Wind Flags:**

4.10.1. No competitor may post or adjust flags after the first match of the day, except for changes in yardage or classes. Flags are to be placed no higher than level of bench top to bottom of the target card. Furthermore, the competitor is to restrict the position of flags to within his competitive shooting lane. A shooting lane is defined as the center lines between benches to the center-lines between target cards unique to each competitor. Lanes that have no competitor may have flags placed in that lane by shooters competing in adjacent lanes. The referees may order a flag to be laid on the ground upon verification that the flag is interfering with a shooter. Posted flags must be left on the range until the completion of the match. The use of wind flags that feed information to a computer that assists the shooter in determining wind information is allowed (eg: smart flags).

4.10.2. The Host Club will assign flag rotations six (6) months ahead of all National events. When the Nationals Match Director sends out the Registration Form, it should include all the flag rotation sponsors and it is the Host Range's responsibility to organize and manage the flag rotation.

4.10.3. Prior to a match (during practice), no shooter may remove another shooters flags on a given bench or force a shooter to move from their bench (official flag setting may not begin until the range announces it.)

4.10.4. At all Nationals, the individual who accepts the job of procuring and setting flags for a flag rotation (sponsor) will have control over what type and how the flags are set for that rotation. Any additions or adjustments to that rotation may only be done with the permission of the flag sponsor for that rotation. If that individual is unable to fulfill their duties as flag rotation sponsor, another sponsor will be approved by

the Match Director. Appeals to the flag set for a given rotation, not resolved with the sponsor, will be made to the referees for the first days' competition, with a majority vote of said referees being needed to change the flag set in question.

4.11. Rifle Positions on the Bench: In all registered Tournaments for any class of competition, the rifle shall be so placed that the muzzle extends forward of the bench and the entire receiver of the rifle is behind the firing line.

4.12. Unused Benches: In all Registered Tournaments, it shall be a requirement that no contestant shall occupy any bench in any relay in which he/she is not shooting.

4.13. Courses of Fire:

4.13.1. The group nationals (unlimited, heavy varmint, light varmint & sporter rifle championship) matches will be held during a time period approved by the Board of Directors. Practice will be allowed at least 3 days prior to the first day of competition. The practice range shall be the same range that will be used for the National Tournament. The course of fire for the National Tournament will be as follows: Monday Unlimited 100 yards, Tuesday Sporter and Light Varmint 100 yards, Wednesday morning Heavy Varmint 100 yards, Wednesday afternoon General Membership meeting, Thursday Unlimited 200 yards, Friday Sporter and Light Varmint 200 yards and Saturday Heavy Varmint 200 yards.

Screamer Patch Specifications

The screamer patch is awarded to members for exceptional groups shot in competition. Your group must be fired in a registered NBRSA match with a moving backer. The backer requirement is removed for 600 & 1000 yard matches only. There is a limit of two (2) patches per year for any member. The screamer criteria is as follows:

Long Range Benchrest:

600-Yards: 5-shot 0.99" - 10-shot 1.99"

1000-Yards: 5-shot 2.99" - 10-shot 4.99"

Short Range Group:

100-Yards: 5-shot group 0.099" - 10-shot group 0.199"

200-Yards: 5-shot group 0.250" - 10-shot group 0.449"

300-Yards: 5-shot group 0.450" - 10-shot group 0.699"

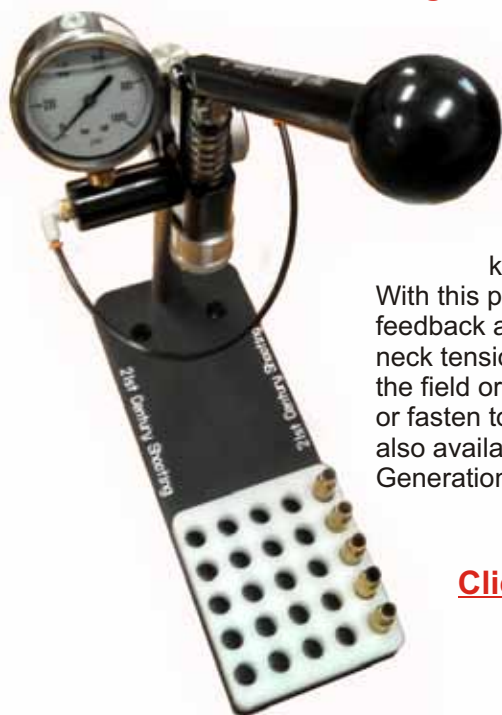

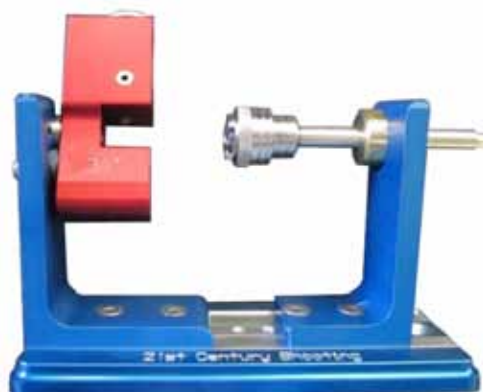
