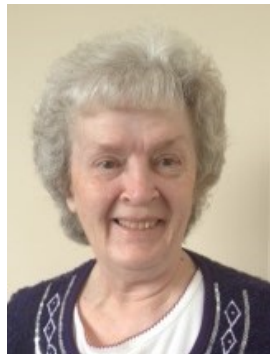


New Life Assembly of God Church, Hyderabad, India

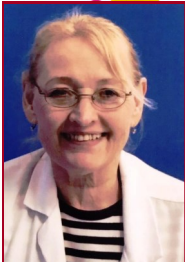

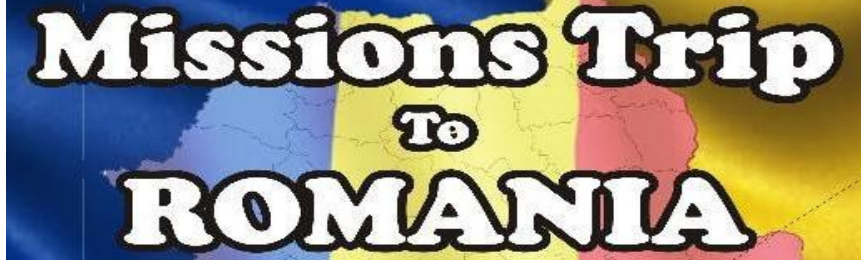
