

Get Started

We recommend you send a press release to your local papers, and you can add it as a story to your website too. You could link to it from social media and newsletters to parents.

Keep things visual:

Enhance your story with images of children and young people taking part in an arts activity in your setting. Use a good camera to get high-quality images so the newspapers can print them (that's usually 300dpi).

Send it by email:

Email it to your local paper. Google can be great for finding contacts of local and regional media journalists and bloggers. In some instances, you may only need to email the editor or news desk.

Follow up by phone:

If you have time, there's no harm in following up with a quick phone call to check your story has been received – keep the call brief as journalists are often working to tight deadlines.



Host a celebration event

Hosting an event or special occasion can help generate further awareness of your award. Suggestions for occasions could include:

- Performances and works of art from your pupils
- A drinks reception to celebrate your occasion

At each event, you may want to share a few words about your achievement. Neither event needs to be longer than a couple of hours in length and can take place at any time of the day.

Who to invite?

You should maximise the opportunity of the event, and consider inviting these groups:

- the local press
- parents
- governors
- local feeder schools
- local MP and other local dignitaries
- local arts and cultural organisations including your regional Bridge and Artsmark Partners
