Welcome to Your Pharmacy Plan

OptumRx manages your pharmacy benefits for your health plan sponsor. We look forward to helping you make informed decisions about medicines for you and your family. Please review this information to better understand your pharmacy benefit plan.

Using Your Member ID Card

You can use your pharmacy benefit ID card at any pharmacy participating in your plan's pharmacy network. Show your ID card each time you fill a prescription at a network pharmacy. They will enter your card information and automatically file it with OptumRx. Your pharmacy will then collect your share of the payment.

Your Pharmacy Network

Your plan's pharmacy network includes more than 67,000 independent and chain retail pharmacies nationwide. To find a network pharmacy near you, use the Locate a Pharmacy tool at www.optumrx.com. Or call Customer Service at **1-877-559-2955**.

Using Non-Network Pharmacies

If you do not show the pharmacy your member ID card, or you fill a prescription at a non-network pharmacy, you must pay 100 percent of the pharmacy's price for the drug. If the drug is covered by your plan, you can be reimbursed. To be reimbursed for eligible prescriptions, simply fill out and send a Direct Member Reimbursement Form with the pharmacy receipt(s) to OptumRx. Reimbursement amounts are based on contracted pharmacy rates minus your copayment or coinsurance. For a copy of the form, go to www.optumrx.com. Or call the Customer Service number above. The number is also on the back of your ID card.

Generic Drugs

Generics are copies of brand name drugs that have been fully tested and approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). They are safe, effective and usually cost much less than their brand-name counterparts. If your doctor prescribes a brand-name drug, ask if a generic drug may be right for you instead. Asking this question before you fill the prescription at a pharmacy may help you save money.

How do I fill a prescription?

When you take your prescription to a network pharmacy, show your ID card to make sure your prescription claim processes correctly.

How do I find a pharmacy in my plan's network?

Visit www.optumrx.com and use the **Locate a Pharmacy** tool. When you enter a ZIP code close to your home or work, you'll get a list of participating pharmacies, their location and phone number. Or call customer service to find a pharmacy near you.

Prior authorization — Premium

Some medications must be authorized for coverage because they're only approved or effective in treating specific conditions.

Reviewing medications

Our review committee of doctors and pharmacists meets often to review medications and coverage under pharmacy benefit plans. They also recommend prior authorization guidelines.

Safe and effective

When making recommendations, the review committee focuses on medication safety, effectiveness and cost, including:

- U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved uses
- Medication instruction labels
- Accepted or published clinical recommendations

Getting a short-term supply

If you must take a medication that requires prior authorization right away, there are two options that may work for you. First, ask your doctor if a sample is available. Or, check with your pharmacy to request a short-term supply of five days or less — keep in mind you will be responsible for the full cost at that time. If the prior authorization request is approved, then your pharmacist can fill the rest of your prescription.

Requesting a prior authorization

You, your pharmacist or your doctor can start the prior authorization process by contacting us. We will work with your doctor to get the information needed for the review. Once we receive a finished prior authorization form from your doctor, we will conduct a review within a few days and send you and your doctor a letter regarding the decision.

In this drug list, brand-name medications are shown in UPPERCASE (for example, CLOBEX) and generic medications in lowercase (for example, clobetasol).

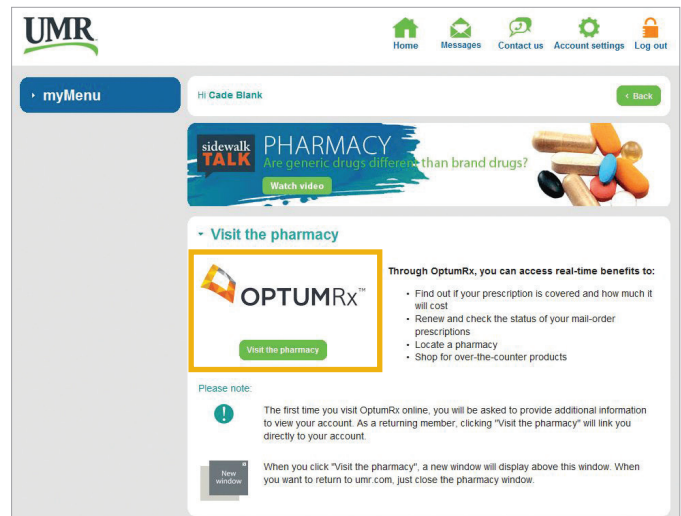
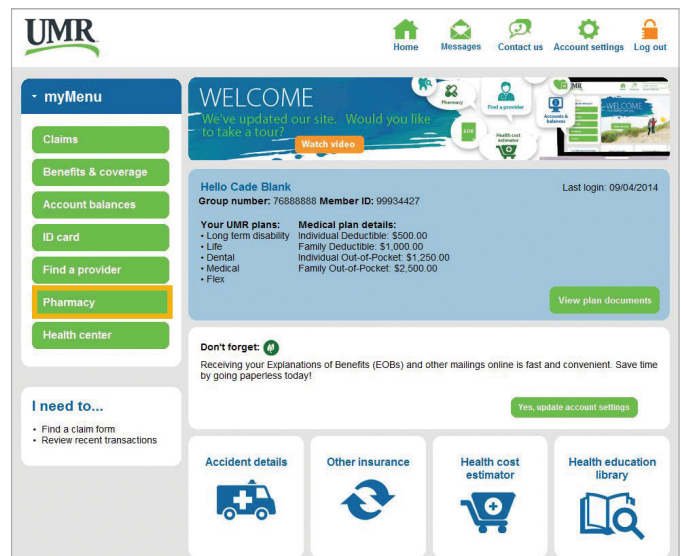
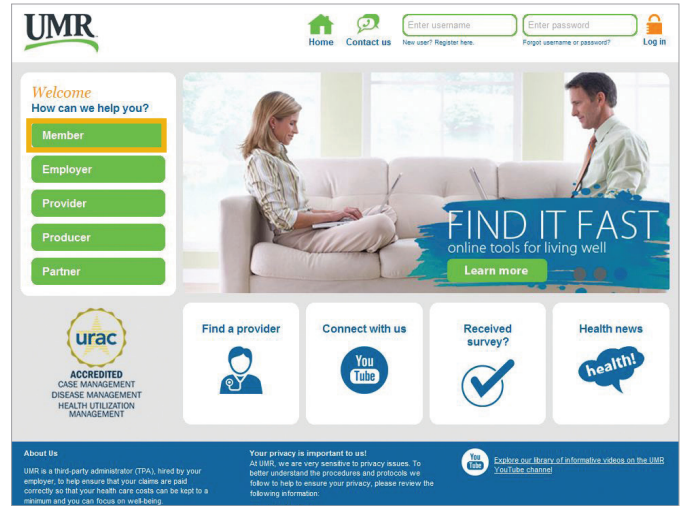

3. Login by entering your username and password in the top right login section. If you have not yet registered for a member account, select **New user? Register here** shown underneath username field.
