

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." Psalm 51: 10a

The verse above brings back memories where as a child I'd sing the Offertory from page
12 and 22 of the old TLH hymnal. In the church where I grew up we used it every Sunday.

Not that I realized it as a child, but the Offertory was a solid reminder of what God could and wanted to do for us. Now as a consequence of that long ago practice, practically every time I hear Psalm 51 I mentally sing the Offertory, "Create in me a clean heart O God and renew a right spirit with in me. Cast me not away from Thy presence; and take not Thy Holy Spirit from me. Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation; and up hold me with Thy free spirit. Amen."

Whenever I hear these words spoken or sung, I am reminded of the much need renewal and restoration that I need. Thankfully, due to your graciously allowing my family a vacation, I have felt some of that renewal and restoration.

We are all in need of renewal. This need is probably the primary reason we take vacations. In the time away from the normal struggles of life we hope to be renewed as we are away from the troubles, the stress, the humdrum of the daily grind to instead do something different, something new, or something that helps us have peace and helps us relax.

Yet... as I think about it, no matter how many vacations a person takes, does this truly renew us? Yes, we hopefully are able to relax and get some much needed rest and recreation, which is very important, but a lot of times we come back from vacation only to find our problems return: that load of guilt, the depression, the stress, finding even more work to catch up on as it piled up during our vacation... so what is the answer?

Psalm 51 has the answer that we need to hear in any situation that troubles us. When we are down and struggling, when we are heavily burdened with life's problems when we have lost hope and want to give up, this Psalm can help us focus on --and go to-- the source of our forgiveness, strength and restoration: our Heavenly Father given through His Son Jesus Christ! And He wants to restore us! That's what God did for King David. Psalm 51 is a Psalm David wrote after the prophet Nathan pointed out David's sins. As a result, David confesses, and in this Psalm he turns to the Source of true renewal and forgiveness. And even though King David had committed some horrible sins, God heard his confession and forgave his sin. May we learn to do as David did and seek renewal and forgiveness from our Lord as well!

Renewing us by giving us forgiveness and thereby restoring our relationship with God is the reason that Jesus came to this earth and suffered and died for us. Let us not neglect to seek and use this great and marvelous gift that He has given! We are renewed and restored by His grace through faith in Him. Jesus is the joy of our salvation!

They were surprised to learn that they had reached three times their goal! Donations from VBS and a door offering totaled \$300.00! So, the kids were able to supply 60 people with fresh drinking water! Way to go!!!




#### **Fun at the National Youth Gathering**


#### **Let God Handle It**


